WHEREAS, ably supported and assisted by Elsie his wife of 47 years, the Reverend I. Joseph Williams has reflected a "desire to make a difference in the lives of people and the will to make changes in the community"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly congratulate the Reverend I. Joseph Williams on attaining his recent milestone and commend him for his years of dedicated service; and, be it
