3 4 5	A BILL to amend and reenact § 32.1-70 of the Code of Virginia and to repeal § 32.1-70.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the statewide cancer registry.

10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 32.1-70 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 32.1-70. Information from hospitals, clinics, certain laboratories and physicians supplied to
13 14	Commissioner; statewide cancer registry.
14	A. Each hospital, clinic and independent pathology laboratory shall make available to the Commissioner or his agents abstracts of their records of information on patients having malignant
16	tumors or cancers. A physician shall report information on patients having cancers unless he has
17	determined that a hospital, clinic or in-state pathology laboratory has reported the information. This
18	reporting requirement shall not apply to basal and squamous cell carcinoma of the skin. Such abstracts
19 20	<i>information</i> shall include the name, address, sex, race, diagnosis and any other pertinent identifying information regarding each such patient and shall include information regarding possible exposure to
2 1	Agent Orange or other defoliants through their development, testing or use or through service in the
22	Vietnam War. Each hospital, clinic, or independent pathology laboratory may elect to , or physician shall
23	provide more extensive other available clinical information as defined by the Commissioner Board of
24 25	Health. B. From such abstracts information the Commissioner shall establish and maintain a statewide cancer
2 6	registry. The purpose of the statewide cancer registry shall include but not be limited to:
27	1. Determining means of improving the diagnosis and treatment of cancer patients.
28	2. Determining the need for and means of providing better long-term, follow-up care of cancer
29 30	2a. Conducting epidemiological analyses of the incidence, prevalence, survival, and risk factors
31	associated with the occurrence of cancer in Virginia.
32	3. Collecting data to evaluate the possible carcinogenic effects of environmental hazards including
33 34	exposure to dioxin and the defoliant, Agent Orange.4. Improving rehabilitative programs for cancer patients.
35	5. Assisting in the training of hospital personnel.
36	6. Determining other needs of cancer patients and health personnel.
37	2. That § 32.1-70.1 of the Code of Virginia is repealed.
