10	WHEREAS, a large number of Virginians each year seek help for a serious mental illness from a
12	system of state facilities and community programs; and
13	WHEREAS, the goal of the mental health system is to provide consumers services in those settings
14	that promote the highest quality of life for them and which complement natural family and community
15 16	resources and supports that are adequate and continuing; and
17	WHEREAS, the provision of the least intrusive levels of support will increase opportunities for people to build upon natural abilities and supports and to take more control over their lives by making
18	their own decisions about the services and supports they want and need; and
19	WHEREAS, new and effective programs, such as antipsychotic medications, intensive community
20	treatment programs, and psychosocial rehabilitation programs have enabled numerous individuals to
21	leave institutions and return to the community, family and jobs, and there is hope that many more will
22	likewise benefit; and
23 24	WHEREAS, job skills and employment opportunities enable persons with serious mental illness to regain some independence and return to their families; now, therefore, be it
24 25	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of
2 6	Rehabilitative Services and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse
27	Services work together to address the employability needs of persons with serious mental illness.
28	The Departments of Rehabilitative Services and of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance
29	Abuse Services shall complete their work in time to submit their findings and recommendations to the
30	Governor and 1999 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of
31	Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

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
