9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 32 4 25 26 27 8 29 31 23 34 5 36 37 89 40 41 42 43	 WHEREAS, Congress passed an amendment to the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children Act, known as "Megan's Law," in April 1996; and WHEREAS, the Virginia State Crime Commission undertook a study to formulate Virginia's response to the federal legislation; and WHEREAS, the Virginia State Crime Commission made a number of recommendations for legislative measures to improve the registration and tracking of sex offenders to the 1997 Virginia General Assembly; and WHEREAS, the Virginia State Crime Commission continued its study of "Megan's Law" in 1997 to develop legislation which enhances public access to information on sex offenders living in the community; and WHEREAS, the Virginia State Crime Commission has adopted a recommendation for legislation which will provide a Virginia web site on "sexually violent offenders' on the internet and allow public access to information on sex offenders registered on the Virginia Sco Offender and Crimes Against Children Registry for introduction to the 1998 Virginia General Assembly; and WHEREAS, the proposed legislation will make major policy changes on the release of information on certain convicted sex offenders in Virginia; and WHEREAS, it is critical that the implementation of the legislation be monitored closely to insure that the goal of enhanced and more expedient availability of sex offender information is achieved; and WHEREAS, it is important to promote public safety and provide the public with the necessary information to take appropriate safety measures; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delgates concurring. That the Virginia State Crime Commission will seek Edward G Byrne grant funds through the Department of criminal Justice Services to assist in the oversight process and to develop a database for the evaluation of the community notification legislation to the suppropriate commission will seek Edward G Byrne grant funds through the Department of Crimina Justice Services to a
