11 WHEREAS, Virginia ranks second in the nation in the amount of municipal waste imported from other states and the tonnage imported is likely to increase as other states close landfills; and 12

WHEREAS, Virginia has ample public and private municipal waste disposal capacity for waste 13 14 generated in the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the negative impacts of truck, rail, and barge traffic and litter, odors, and noise 15 16 associated with waste imports occur not just at the location of final disposal but also along waste 17 transportation routes, and current landfill technology has the potential to fail, leading to long-term 18 cleanup and other associated costs; and

WHEREAS, the importation of waste runs counter to the repeatedly-expressed strong desire of 19 20 Virginia's citizens for clean air, land, and water and for the preservation of Virginia's unique historic and 21 cultural character, and it is essential to promote and preserve these attributes; and

22 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has demonstrated the ability to attract good jobs and to promote 23 sound economic development without relying on the importation of garbage; and

WHEREAS, in 1995, 23 governors wrote to the Commerce Committee of the United States Congress 24 25 urging passage of legislation allowing states and localities the power to regulate waste entering their 26 jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, legislation is pending before the Commerce Committee that would provide states and 27 28 localities with the authority to control the importation of waste, a power that is essential to the public 29 health, safety, and welfare of all citizens of Virginia; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the United States Congress be 30 urged to enact legislation giving states and localities the power to control waste imports into their 31 32 jurisdiction which includes: (i) a ban on waste imports in the absence of specific approval from the 33 disposal site host community and governor of the host state; (ii) authorization for governors to freeze 34 solid waste imports at 1993 levels; (iii) authorization for states to consider whether a disposal facility is needed locally when deciding whether to grant a permit; and (iv) authorization for states to limit the

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
