[H 2490] 7 8 Approved 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 10 1. That §§ 2.1-1.5 and 10.1-2402 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 2.1-1.5. 118 § 10.1-2402. Powers of the Foundation; establishment of Virginia Historic Preservation Revolving 119 Fund; transfer of assets. 120

A. In order to carry out its purpose, the Foundation shall have the following powers:

121 1. To establish, administer, manage, including the creation of reserves, and make expenditures from a 122 special nonreverting trust fund on the books of the Comptroller which shall be known as the Historic 123 Preservation Revolving Fund, hereinafter referred to as the Fund, for the sole purpose of the preservation 124 of properties on or eligible for the Virginia Landmarks Register through fee simple acquisition of the 125 properties, or interest therein, retention of a perpetual preservation easement on acquired properties, and 126 subsequent resale of properties thus protected to appropriate persons, firms, or corporations; or transfer 127 to appropriate state agencies. The Fund shall be used only when, in the discretion of the Board of 128 Trustees, acquisition and subsequent resale are the best feasible means of protecting such properties from 129 an identifiable threat of destruction or of the loss of those qualities for which it is designated or eligible 130 to be designated as a landmark by the Virginia Historic Resources Board. The Fund shall include such 131 funds as may be appropriated by the General Assembly from time to time and designated for the Fund, 132 gifts and bequests and all proceeds from the resale of properties, income, interest, dividends, and 133 appreciation which may accrue thereto. Any moneys designated for the Fund shall remain in the Fund 134 and shall not revert to the general fund.

135 In making any determination as to the acquisition in fee simple of any real property, the trustees 136 shall consider, among such other factors as they deem appropriate, the potential for subsequent resale of 137 the property under consideration.

138 2. To accept, hold, administer and receive gifts and bequests of money, securities, or other property 139 of whatsoever character, absolutely or in trust, to the Fund, for the purposes for which the Foundation is **140** created. Unless otherwise restricted by the terms of the gift or bequest, the Foundation is authorized to 141 sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of such money, securities, or other property given or bequeathed to 142 it in furtherance of its objectives. 143

3. To enter into contracts and agreements to accomplish the purposes of the Foundation.

144 4. Generally to do any and all lawful acts necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes for 145 which the Foundation is created.

146 B. The Foundation may transfer the assets of the Fund to the Association for the Preservation of 147 Virginia Antiquities, as Trustee, to constitute the trust fund under the trust agreement authorized by § 1 148 of the second enactment of this act; however, if, prior to January 1, 2003, the Governor directs the 149 reconveyance of such trust fund pursuant to subsection C of § 2 of the second enactment of this act, the 150 trust assets shall be returned to the Foundation to be deposited in the Historic Preservation Revolving 151 Fund.

152 2. § 1. That the Board of Trustees of the Virginia Historic Preservation Foundation and the Director of 153 the Department of Historic Resources are authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth to enter into a trust agreement with the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities, whereby the 154 155 Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities shall be trustee and the Commonwealth shall be 156 beneficiary. The Board of Trustees of the Virginia Historic Preservation Foundation is authorized to 157 create a trust fund, to be known as the Historic Preservation Trust Fund, known hereafter as the "Trust 158 Fund," by transferring all of the assets of the Virginia Historic Preservation Revolving Fund to the 159 Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities, as Trustee of the Trust Fund, including its cash, 160 notes, mortgages, other securities, real estate and all its other assets, to be administered as follows:

161 1. The Trustee shall serve without compensation;

162 2. The Trust Fund shall be administered and managed by the Property Committee of the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities; 163

164 3. The Director of the Department of Historic Resources, or his designee, shall serve as a voting 165 member of the Property Committee of the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities on all 166 questions concerning properties to be acquired and sold by the Trust Fund;

4. The Trust Fund shall be used for the sole purpose of preserving properties listed or eligible for 167 168 listing on the Virginia Landmarks Register through the acquisition of such properties, or interests 169 therein, the donation of a perpetual preservation easement on such properties to the Board of Historic 170 Resources, and the subsequent resale of properties, or interests therein, thus protected to appropriate 171 individuals, corporations partnerships, associations or other legal entities, or the resale or transfer to 172 appropriate public agencies, when, in the discretion of the Trustee, such action is the best feasible 173 means of protecting such properties from an identifiable threat of destruction or from the loss of those 174 qualities for which they were designated or eligible to be designated as landmarks by the Board of 175 Historic Resources; and

176 5. The Trust Fund shall be operated as a revolving fund and all proceeds from the resale of 177 properties, and any income which may accrue on the trust properties, shall be returned to and deposited 178 in the Trust Fund.

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179 The terms, conditions and form of the trust agreement shall be reviewed and approved by the **180** Governor and the Attorney General.

§ 2. A. The Trust Fund shall consist of the property received pursuant to § 1 and any gifts, grants, 181 182 or appropriations made to the Trust Fund. Gifts and bequests of money, securities, and other property 183 to the Trust Fund, and the income therefrom, shall be deemed to be gifts to the Commonwealth and 184 therefore exempt from all state and local taxes. Any income earned from gifts, bequests, rent, securities, and other property of the Trust Fund shall be the property of the Trust Fund. Any gifts received by the 185 Virginia Historic Preservation Foundation while the Association for the Preservation of Virginia 186 187 Antiquities is administering the Trust Fund, as well as any income which may accrue thereon, shall be 188 deposited in the Trust Fund within ninety days of receipt.

189 B. By November 1 of each year, the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities shall
190 submit a copy of its audited financial statement to the Director of the Department of Historic Resources
191 and to the Attorney General.

C. Prior to January 1, 2003, the Board of Trustees of the Virginia Historic Preservation Foundation
is authorized to review the operation of the Trust Fund. If it finds that such operation is not fulfilling
the requirements of the trust agreement, it may recommend to the Governor that the trust agreement
with the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities be terminated. If the Governor finds
that such termination is in the best interest of the Commonwealth, he may direct the Association for the
Preservation of Virginia Antiquities to reconvey all the assets of the Trust Fund to the Virginia Historic
Preservation Foundation.

D. On and after January 1, 2003, if the Fund has not been reconveyed to the Virginia Historic
Preservation Foundation, (i) the Foundation shall cease to exist and its minutes and any remaining
assets shall become the property of the Department of Historic Resources and (ii) the Attorney General
shall have the authority to take legal action on behalf of the Commonwealth to enforce the terms of the
trust agreement established under § 1.

3. That the amendments made by this act to § 2.1-1.5 shall become effective January 1, 2003, if the assets of the Virginia Historic Trust Fund have not been reconveyed to the Virginia Historic Preservation Foundation under subsection C of § 2 of the second enactment of this act.

4. That Chapter 24 (§§ 10.1-2400 through 10.1-2404) of Title 10.1 of the Code of Virginia is repealed effective January 1, 2003, if the assets of the Virginia Historic Trust Fund have not been reconveyed to the Virginia Historic Preservation Foundation under subsection C of § 2 of the second enactment of this act.
