11 12 13	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 24.2-405 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 24.2-405. Persons who may obtain lists of registered voters.
15 16	A. The State Board shall furnish, at a reasonable price, lists of registered voters for their districts to (i) courts of the Commonwealth and the United States for jury selection purposes, (ii) candidates for
17	election or political party nomination to further their candidacy, (iii) political party committees or
18 19	officials thereof for political purposes only, (iv) incumbent officeholders to report to their constituents, and (v) nonprofit organizations which promote voter participation and registration for that purpose only.
20	The lists shall be furnished to no one else and used for no other purpose, except that the State Board is
21	authorized to furnish information from the voter registration system to general registrars for their official
22 23	use. B. The State Board shall furnish, at a reasonable price, lists of the addresses of registered voters for
23 24	their localities to local government census liaisons and their staff for the sole purpose of providing
25	address information to the United States Bureau of the Census. No list furnished under this subsection
26 27	shall contain the name of any registered voter. For the purpose of this subsection, the term "census
27 28	<i>liaison" shall have the meaning provided in 13 U. S. C. § 16.</i> <i>C.</i> In no event shall any list furnished under this section contain the social security number of any
29	registered voter except a list furnished to a court of the Commonwealth or of the United States for jury
30	selection purposes.
31	D. Any list furnished under subsection A of this section shall contain the post office box address in
32 33	lieu of the residence street address for any active or retired law-enforcement officer, as defined in § 9-169 and in 5 U.S.C.A. § 8331 (20) but excluding officers whose duties relate to detention as defined
34	in paragraphs (A) through (D) of § 8331 (20), who has furnished at the time of registration or
35	subsequently, in addition to his street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on
36	such lists.
37 38	<i>E</i> . Any printed precinct list furnished under <i>subsection A of</i> this section shall contain the post office box address in lieu of the residence street address for any party granted a protective order as described
30 39	in §§ 16.1-253.1, 16.1-253.4, 16.1-279.1, and 18.2-60.3, who has furnished at the time of registration or
40	subsequently, in addition to his street address, a post office box address for his residence for use on
41	such lists.
