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12	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13	1. That § 18.2-51.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted, and that the Code of
14	Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-57.1:1 as follows:
15	§ 18.2-51.1. Malicious and reckless bodily injury to law-enforcement officers or firefighters; penalty;
16	lesser included offense.
17	If any person maliciously causes bodily injury to another by any means including the means set out
18	in § 18.2-52, with intent to maim, disfigure, disable or kill, and knowing or having reason to know that
19	such other person is a law-enforcement officer, as defined hereinafter, or firefighter, as defined in
20	§ 65.2-102, engaged in the performance of his public duties as a law-enforcement officer or firefighter,
21	such person shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for a period of not less than five
22 23	years nor more than thirty years and, subject to subdivision (g) of § 18.2-10, a fine of not more than \$100,000. Upon conviction, the sentence of such person shall include a mandatory, minimum term of
23 24	imprisonment of two years.
25	If any person unlawfully, but not maliciously, with the intent aforesaid, causes bodily injury to
26	another by any means, knowing or having reason to know such other person is a law-enforcement
27	officer as defined hereinafter, or firefighter, as defined in § 65.2-102, engaged in the performance of his
28	public duties as a law-enforcement officer or firefighter, he shall be guilty of a Class 6 felony, and upon
29	conviction, the sentence of such person shall include a mandatory, minimum term of imprisonment of
30	one year.
31	If any person recklessly causes bodily injury to another by any means, knowing or having reason to
32	know such other person is a law-enforcement officer as defined hereinafter, or firefighter, as defined in
33	§ 65.2-102, engaged in the performance of his public duties as a law-enforcement officer or firefighter,
34 25	with the intent to impede or prevent the officer or firefighter from performing his duties, he shall be
35 36	guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the right of any person charged with a violation
30 37	of this section from asserting and presenting evidence in support of any defenses to the charge that may
38	be available under common law.
39	As used in this section the term "mandatory, minimum" means that the sentence it describes shall be
40	served with no suspension of sentence in whole or in part.
41	As used in this section a law-enforcement officer means any full-time or part-time employee of a
42	police department or sheriff's office which is part of or administered by the Commonwealth or any
43	political subdivision thereof, and who is responsible for the prevention or detection of crime and the
44	enforcement of the penal, traffic or highway laws of this Commonwealth, any conservation officer of the
45	Department of Conservation and Recreation commissioned pursuant to § 10.1-115, and includes auxiliary
46	police officers appointed or provided for pursuant to §§ 15.1-159.2 and 15.1-159.4 and auxiliary deputy
47 19	sheriffs appointed pursuant to § 15.1-48.
48 49	The provisions of § 18.2-51 shall be deemed to provide a lesser included offense hereof. § 18.2-57.1:1. Disarming a law-enforcement officer; penalty.
5 0	Any individual who knows or has reason to know a person is a law-enforcement officer engaged in
50 51	the performance of his public duties and, with the intent to impede or prevent the officer from
52	performing his duties, knowingly and without the permission of the officer (i) removes a firearm from
53	the possession of the officer or deprives the officer of the use of the firearm is guilty of a Class 6 felony
54	or (ii) removes a chemical irritant weapon, stun weapon or impact weapon from the possession of the
55	officer or deprives the officer of the use of the weapon is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
56	Any sentence of confinement imposed upon a conviction of this section shall be served consecutively
57	with any other term of confinement imposed upon the offender

with any other term of confinement imposed upon the offender.
That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment in state correctional facilities. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation

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
