11 12 13	WHEREAS, Virginia's sheriffs' offices are responsible for operating jails, securing the courthouses, and serving process; and
14 15	WHEREAS, inadequate staffing of these functions has serious implications for local governments and the Commonwealth relative to the safety and security of citizens, sheriffs and their staffs, and inmates in
16 17	local correctional facilities and the efficient operation of the judicial system; and WHEREAS, the current process for funding sheriffs' departments is a traditional budgeting and
18	reimbursement process that has undergone little revision in the last 50 years; and
19 20	WHEREAS, although the Compensation Board uses the staffing standards set forth in the budget in addition to requests from local departments, significant discrepancies exist between state-recognized
21	staffing levels and actual workload in many departments; and
22 23	WHEREAS, although the 1998 General Assembly provided for an increase in staffing standards for law-enforcement deputies, this improvement benefited only those localities without police departments;
24 25	and WHEREAS, staffing standards for sheriffs' deputies involved in jail operations, court security and
26	process services remain unchanged; and
27 28	WHEREAS, there is a need to develop staffing standards for sheriffs' departments which more accurately reflect actual workloads and requirements and to determine the number and funding of
29 30	additional positions that such revised standards may indicate are necessary; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
31	Review Commission be directed to study staffing standards for sheriffs' departments for the provision of
32 33	jail operations, courthouse security and process services. Technical assistance for the study shall be provided by the Virginia Sheriffs' Association. All
34	agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the committees, upon request.
35 36 37	The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 2000 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
