10	WHEREAS, many people who have been convicted of drunk driving are seemingly impervious to
11	traditional sanctions and continue to drive, despite the fact their licenses have been suspended or
12	revoked; and
13	WHEREAS, there are increased public safety hazards, including innocent deaths across the
14	Commonwealth every year, as a result of repeated violations of both driving under the influence and
15	driving on a suspended license; and
16	WHEREAS, currently there are campaigns in several states and in the United States Congress to
17	promulgate laws which employ the seizure of the vehicles of recalcitrant drunk drivers in order to
18	ensure compliance with the suspension of driving privileges; now, therefore, be it
19 20	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia State Crime
20 21	Commission be directed to conduct a study of the effectiveness of vehicle seizure in reducing re-arrest among recalcitrant drunk drivers. The study shall investigate (i) the feasibility of implementing such a
22	program in the Commonwealth, (ii) the benefits of vehicle seizure, and (iii) the effectiveness of any

24	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission for this study, upon
25	request.
26	The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the
