992723836 **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 566** 1 2 House Amendments in [] - February 7, 1999 3 Establishing the [Blue Ribbon 21st Century] Commission on Education. 4 5 6 Patrons-Hamilton, Jackson, Albo, Bennett, Darner and Jones, J.C.; Senators: Houck, Howell and Potts 7 Referred to Committee on Rules 8 9 WHEREAS, the demands of an increasingly competitive 21st century global marketplace will 10 challenge Virginia's system of public education to prepare its students to learn, adapt, and expand their 11 skills in the workforce: and WHEREAS, because the "fundamental goal of the public schools," as articulated in the Standards of Quality, is to "enable each student to develop the skills that are necessary for success in school and 12 13 preparation for life," it is essential that our public schools equip students with the tools that will allow 14 them to wisely choose among the options of directly entering the workforce, obtaining postsecondary 15 16 technical education or training, attending college, graduate, or professional school, or combining these 17 objectives; and WHEREAS, the Standards of Quality direct school boards to infuse throughout the K-12 curricula 18 career education programs that "promote knowledge of careers and all types of employment 19 20 opportunities including, but not limited to, apprenticeships, the military, and career education schools, 21 and emphasize the advantages of completing school with marketable skills"; and WHEREAS, pursuant to § 22.1-209, local school boards are required to "make available to secondary 22 23 students employment counseling and placement services to furnish information relating to the 24 employment opportunities available to students graduating from or leaving the public schools in the 25 school division which shall include all types of employment opportunities, including, but not limited to, 26 apprenticeships, the military, and career education schools"; and 27 WHEREAS, supplementing these career planning efforts are programs created pursuant to § 22.1-209.01 to prepare students for "postsecondary education eligibility, employment, and advanced 28 29 technical skills training," as well as career guidance counseling designed to "furnish information on 30 available employment opportunities to all students," as required by § 22.1-253.13:1 D, and pupil personnel services for grades K-12 to aid students in their educational, social, and career development 31 32 pursuant to § 22.1-253.13:2 D; and 33 WHEREAS, recognizing the importance of workforce development training programs, the Governor 34 of Virginia has directed the Secretary of Commerce and Trade to review such programs in an effort to 35 promote economic development efforts in the Commonwealth; and 36 WHEREAS, the President of the State Board of Education has acknowledged the need for all 37 students to be held to a standard of learning that will enhance the skills and abilities of students entering 38 the workforce or pursuing higher education; and 39 WHEREAS, to increase the quality of public education in Virginia and to improve coordination 40 between public education and workforce development training, it is imperative to build on those existing 41 and revised standards, programs, and initiatives that ensure the greatest educational and professional 42 development opportunities; and 43 WHEREAS, while Virginia has made great progress in increasing educational quality and in 44 preparing its young people for the world of work with the implementation of revised Standards of Learning for mathematics, English, science, and history and social science in 1995, new Standards of 45 Accreditation for public schools in 1997, and in a broad range of workforce training initiatives, further 46 47 study is needed to determine ways to enhance linkages between public education and workforce **48** development and to assist students in acquiring necessary work habits, developing marketable skills, 49 coordinating courses of study, and identifying career goals; now, therefore, be it 50 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the [Blue Ribbon 21st Century 51] Commission on Education be established. The Commission shall be composed of 15 members as follows: 3 members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; 2 members 52 53 of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; 5 citizens 54 representing business, education, and industry to be appointed by the Governor; the Secretary of Education; the Secretary of Commerce and Trade; and the Superintendent of Public Instruction; the 55 Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System; and the Director of the State Council of Higher 56 57 Education for Virginia, who shall serve ex officio with full voting privileges. The Commission shall study (i) the integration of the Standards of Learning with middle and high 58 59 school curricula and programs that focus on workforce development skills; (ii) the availability of these

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60 middle and high school workforce development opportunities to students across the Commonwealth; (iii)

61 the adequacy of current curricula, program resources, and technology in the public schools statewide; 62 (iv) staffing and state and local funding levels for middle and high school workforce development 63 programs; (v) the efficacy of current state and local coordination and governance of middle and high 64 school workforce development programs; (vi) the need for training and technical assistance for 65 workforce development educators; (vii) the use of the Standards of Learning and national business and 66 industry standards to enhance the quality of these curricula and programs; and (viii) such other issues as 67 it deems appropriate.

The Department of Education shall provide staff support for the study. The staffs of the Virginia Business Education Partnership, the Virginia Community College System, [and] the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia [, and the Governor's Employment and Training Department] shall provide technical assistance for the study. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.

73 The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$10,000.

74 The Commission shall submit an interim report to the Governor and the 2000 Session of the General 75 Assembly and shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the 76 Governor and the 2001 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division 77 of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

78 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint

79 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the study.
