12	with regard to those persons with some level of visual impairment; and
13	WHEREAS, there are a variety of programs available to persons with differing levels of sight to
14	assist them in remaining independent and able to experience life to its fullest; and
15	WHEREAS, over the years the terminology referring to those with visual impairment has changed
16	for a number of reasons, including the "People First" movement which recognizes that the person is the
17	primary focus of attention, and the handicap is secondary; and
18 19	WHEREAS, references in the Code of Virginia are inconsistent and confusing; and WHEREAS, there needs to be some standardization throughout state law with meaned to references to
20	WHEREAS, there needs to be some standardization throughout state law with regard to references to those persons with a visual impairment, but a close evaluation of each reference must be done to

22	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department for the Visually
23	Handicapped undertake a review of the statutory references to persons with visual impairment which
24	appear in the Code and determine how we can best standardize these references so that they are
25	accurate.

27	Handicapped for this study, upon request.
28	The Department for the Visually Handicapped shall complete its work in time to submit its findings
29 30 31	and recommendations to the Governor and the 2000 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
