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HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 658

Offered January 21, 1999

Continuing the Interstate Route 73 Communications Committee.

9 WHEREAS, through its passage of House Joint Resolution No. 153, the 1998 Session of the General Assembly created the Interstate Route 73 Communications Committee to provide an institutional and 10 organizational link between the citizens and businesses of south-central Virginia and their legislative 11 representatives in the General Assembly and the Virginia Department of Transportation and to receive 12 and disseminate communication between the Department and those most directly and greatly concerned 13 14 with the speedy completion and success of the Interstate Route 73 project; and

WHEREAS, in the course of its work during 1998, the Committee determined that, although there is 15 16 considerable and broad-based public support for the Interstate Route 73 project in communities throughout the region to be served by the highway, no decision has yet been made as to whether or 17 18 where the highway will be built; and

WHEREAS, if findings of preliminary studies lead to decisions by the Commonwealth Transportation 19 20 Board and the Federal Highway Administration to determine a route for the highway and acquire needed 21 rights-of-way, actual construction on the project is still years away and its completion may lie more than 22 a decade in the future; and

23 WHEREAS, the importance of the Interstate Route 73 project to regional economic development and 24 the long-term nature of the project underscore the need to continue the work of the Interstate Route 73 25 Communications Committee; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Interstate Route 73 26 27 Communications Committee, created under House Joint Resolution No. 153 in 1998, be hereby 28 continued. The membership of the Committee shall continue as provided in the original resolution, with 29 any vacancies to be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. 30

The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$21,600.

31 The Committee shall complete its work in time to submit any findings and recommendations it shall 32 deem appropriate to the Governor and the 2001 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the 33 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 34 documents.

35 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 36 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the 37 study.
