999444828 **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 675** 1 2 Offered January 21, 1999 3 Requesting the Technical Advisory Panel of the Virginia Indigent Health Care Trust Fund to examine 4 the feasibility of establishing a pilot pharmacy program for the indigent. 5 6 Patrons-Diamonstein, Armstrong, Baker, Bennett, Brink, Callahan, Christian, Cranwell, Davies, 7 DeBoer, Deeds, Grayson, Hall, Hamilton, Hull, Jones, D.C., Melvin, Morgan, Phillips, Putney, 8 Robinson, Tate, Van Landingham and Williams; Senators: Bolling, Gartlan, Lambert, Marsh, Puckett, 9 Reynolds, Schrock, Ticer, Walker and Woods 10 Referred to Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions 11 12 13 WHEREAS, access to necessary prescription medications is critical to the prevention and treatment 14 of a wide range of health conditions and diseases; and 15 WHEREAS, the cost of prescription medications has increased substantially in recent years; and WHEREAS, the 1996 Health Access Survey of Virginians found that approximately 13 percent, or 16 17 858,000 persons, are uninsured; and 18 WHEREAS, the 1996 survey also found that when compared to persons with insurance coverage, the uninsured are three times more likely not to get a prescription filled because of the high cost of 19 20 prescription medications; and 21 WHEREAS, the 1996 survey also found that 13 percent of the respondents were unable to purchase 22 needed prescriptions due to costs; and 23 WHEREAS, the Virginia Association of Free Clinics and the Virginia Primary Care Association 24 report that access to prescription medications is the most critical health care need of their indigent and 25 uninsured patients; and 26 WHEREAS, the Indigent Health Care Trust Fund receives moneys appropriated by the 27 Commonwealth and contributions from certain hospitals for the purpose of reimbursing hospitals for 28 unreimbursed inpatient and outpatient medical care provided to certain indigent persons; and 29 WHEREAS, the Technical Advisory Panel established in § 32.1-335 assists the Board of Medical 30 Assistance Services in the administration of the Indigent Health Care Trust Fund; and 31 WHEREAS, one of the responsibilities of the Technical Advisory Panel is to establish pilot health 32 care projects for the uninsured and administer any money voluntarily contributed or donated to the fund 33 by private or public sources for the purpose of subsidizing pilot health care projects for the uninsured; 34 and 35 WHEREAS, in a 1998 study conducted by the Virginia Department of Health regarding ways the 36 Commonwealth can support Free Clinics and Community Health Centers, the Department found that improving access to pharmaceuticals is one of the most pressing needs of the Free Clinics and 37 38 Community Health Centers in serving their respective indigent and uninsured patients; and 39 WHEREAS, one of the core options for supporting the Free Clinics and Community Health Centers 40 identified by the 1998 Department of Health study was to request the Technical Advisory Panel of the 41 Indigent Health Care Trust Fund to consider establishing a pilot pharmacy program for the indigent as a 42 means of increasing access to pharmaceuticals for the indigent and uninsured; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Technical Advisory Panel 43 44 of the Indigent Health Care Trust Fund be requested to examine the feasibility of establishing a pilot 45 pharmacy program for the indigent as a means of improving access to prescription medications for the indigent and uninsured. The feasibility study shall include, but not be limited to, examining (i) 46 47 alternative program designs, (ii) necessary administrative systems, (iii) scope, duration, location, and **48** estimated costs of the pilot, and (iv) potential funding sources; and, be it 49 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Technical Advisory Panel of the Indigent Health Care Trust Fund 50 shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Board of Medical Assistance Services and the Joint Commission on Health Care by September 1, 1999, and to the Governor and the 2000 Session of the 51 General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for 52 53 the processing of legislative documents.

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
