11	WHEREAS, telemedicine is defined as the use of telecommunications technology to deliver health
12	care services and health professions education to sites that are distant from the host site or educator; and
13	WHEREAS, telemedicine has increased access to health care, particularly for residents of remote
14	areas requiring sub-specialty services; and
15	WHEREAS, a number of state agencies are now involved in telemedicine initiatives including the
16 17	Department of Corrections, the Medical College of Virginia, the University of Virginia Health Sciences Center, the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation, and Substance Abuse Services, and the
18	Department of Health; and
19	WHEREAS, the technology for telemedicine services is changing rapidly; and
20	WHEREAS, the equipment purchased for telemedicine represents a significant investment; and
21	WHEREAS, telemedicine offers the opportunity for cooperation among a number of state agencies in
22 23	serving the health care and health professions education needs of Virginians; and
23 24	WHEREAS, the Governor has recently appointed a Secretary of Technology; now, therefore be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates the Senate concurring, That the Secretary of Technology, in
25	cooperation with affected state agencies, develop guidelines to ensure compatibility, to the extent
26	feasible, among the telemedicine equipment purchased by state agencies involved in telemedicine; and,
27	be it
28	RESOLVED FURTHER, That all agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the
29 30	Secretary of Technology, upon request; and, be it RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Secretary of Technology's findings and recommendations shall be
31	submitted to the Joint Commission on Health Care prior to October 1, 1999 and shall be submitted to
32	the Governor and the 2000 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the
