WHEREAS, V. Rea Jones served the Commonwealth in the Virginia National Guard, retiring at the rank of brigadier general; and

WHEREAS, an active member of the North Pamunkey Baptist Church, V. Rea Jones has been a deacon, Sunday School teacher, Sunday School director, trustee, and member of various church committees; and

WHEREAS, V. Rea Jones has been compassionate in caring for others and is devoted to his family; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly commend V. Rea Jones for his lifetime of service to Orange County and the Commonwealth; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to V. Rea Jones as an expression of the General Assembly's appreciation and gratitude for his many contributions to the citizens of Orange County.
