10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 28.2-708 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 28.2-708. Limitations on sizes of crabs to be taken; inspection of catch; exemption; penalty.
13	A. It is unlawful for any person to catch, take or have in his possession more than ten hard crabs per
14	United States standard bushel or thirty-five hard crabs per barrel, which measure less than five inches
15	across the shell from tip to tip of the longest spikes, or to destroy them in any manner. Those
16	undersized crabs in excess of the allowance level shall be immediately returned to the water alive. Adult
17	female crabs, peeler crabs and soft crabs are exempt from these limitations.
18	B. Any officer may grade or cull any number of barrels, baskets or containers of crabs in any
19	person's possession.
20	If the officer finds more than ten undersize hard crabs per United States standard bushel or thirty-five
21	per barrel, he shall seize the entire quantity of crabs in or from each such container, and the person who
22	possessed the crabs shall immediately return them to the water. Refusal to return the crabs to the water
23	is a separate offense from any other violation.
24	C. The requirement in subsections A and B to return crabs to the waters shall apply to crabs taken
25	and in possession of a crabber or catcher but shall not apply to crabs which have been purchased by and
26	are in the possession of a buyer, nor shall it apply to crabs which have been transported at least five
27	miles from the nearest salt water.
28	D. It is unlawful for any person to catch, take or have in his possession peeler crabs which measure
29	less than three inches across the shell from tip to tip of the longest spikes or soft crabs which measure
30	less than three and one-half inches across the shell from tip to tip of the longest spikes.
31	DE. The Commission may change such the five-inch size restrictions found in this section for a
32	period not to exceed sixty days to respond to significant ecological changes.
33	EF. A violation of this section is a Class 3 misdemeanor.
