A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-32 of the Code of Virginia, relating to salaries of the Hampton school board.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 22.1-32 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 22.1-32. (Effective October 1, 1998) Salary of members.

A. The school board of the following counties may pay each of its members an annual salary not to exceed the limits hereinafter set forth:

145 C. Any school board may, in its discretion, pay the chairman of the school board an additional salary
 146 not exceeding \$1,100 per year upon passage of an appropriate resolution by (i) the school board whose
 147 membership is elected in whole or in part or (ii) the governing body of the appropriate county, city, or
 148 town whose school board is comprised solely of appointed members.

149 D. Any school board may in its discretion pay each of its members' mileage for use of a private
 150 vehicle in attending meetings of the school board and in conducting other official business of the school
 151 board. Its members may be reimbursed for private transportation at a rate not to exceed that which is
 152 authorized for persons traveling on state business in accordance with § 2.1-20.10. Whatever rate is paid,
 153 however, shall be the same for school board members and employees of the board.

154 E. Contingent upon finalization of the planned consolidation of the school divisions of Alleghany
 155 County and the City of Clifton Forge, the members of the newly consolidated school board representing
 156 the City of Clifton Forge shall be paid an amount equal to that paid the members of the present school
 157 board of Alleghany County.

158 F. No school board shall request the General Assembly's consideration of an increase in its annual
 159 salary limit as established in this section unless such school board has taken an affirmative vote on the
 160 requested increase. Further, no school board, whose membership is elected in whole or in part, shall be
 161 awarded a salary increase, unless, upon an affirmative vote by such school board, a specific salary
 162 increase, within the limit set herein, shall be approved. Local school boards shall adopt such increases
 163 according to the following procedures:

164 1. A local school board representing a county may establish a salary increase prior to July 1 in any
 165 year in which members are to be elected or appointed, or, if such school board is elected or appointed
 166 for staggered terms, prior to July 1 of any year in which at least one-half of such members are to be
 167 elected or appointed. Such increase shall become effective on January 1 of the following year.

168 2. A local school board representing a city or town may establish a salary increase prior to January 1
 169 in any year in which members are to be elected or appointed. Such increase shall become effective on
 170 July 1 of the following year.

171 No salary increase may become effective during an incumbent member's term of office; however, this
 172 restriction shall not apply if the school board members are elected or appointed for staggered terms.
