- **415** § 54.1-2900. Definitions.
- 416 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:

"Acupuncturist" means individuals approved by the Board to practice acupuncture. This is limited to
"licensed acupuncturist" which means an individual other than a doctor of medicine, osteopathy or
podiatry, who has successfully completed the requirements for licensure established by the Board
(approved titles are limited to: Licensed Acupuncturist, Lic.Ac., and L.Ac.) and "physician
acupuncturist" which means doctors of medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic and podiatry who have
fulfilled the physician requirements for licensure to practice acupuncture established by the Board.

"Auricular acupuncture" means the subcutaneous insertion of sterile, disposable acupuncture needles
in predetermined, bilateral locations in the outer ear when used exclusively and specifically in the
context of an approved chemical dependency treatment program, under the appropriate supervision of a
licensed physician acupuncturist or licensed acupuncturist.

- 427 "Board" means the Board of Medicine.
- 428 "Healing arts" means the arts and sciences dealing with the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and cure

429 or alleviation of human physical or mental ailments, conditions, diseases, pain or infirmities.

"Physician assistant" means an individual who has met the requirements of the Board for licensureand who works under the supervision of a licensed doctor of medicine, osteopathy, or podiatry.

432 "Practice of acupuncture" means the stimulation of certain points on or near the surface of the body 433 by the insertion of needles to prevent or modify the perception of pain or to normalize physiological 434 functions, including pain control, for the treatment of certain ailments or conditions of the body and 435 includes the techniques of electroacupuncture, cupping and moxibustion. The practice of acupuncture does not include the use of physical therapy, chiropractic, or osteopathic manipulative techniques, the 436 use or prescribing of any drugs, medications, herbal preparations, nutritional supplements, serums or 437 438 vaccines, nor; or the procedure of auricular acupuncture as exempted in § 54.1-2901 when used 439 specifically and exclusively in the context of a publicly supported comprehensive drug treatment 440 program by an employee of the program who is trained and approved by the National Acupuncture 441 Detoxification Association.

"Practice of athletic training" means the prevention, recognition, evaluation, and treatment of
injuries or conditions related to physical activity immediately upon the onset of such injury or condition,
and the subsequent treatment and rehabilitation of injuries or conditions related to physical activity,
under the direction of a licensed physical therapist and the patient's physician or under the direction of
any doctor of medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic, podiatry or dentistry, while using heat, light, sound,
cold, electricity, exercise, or mechanical or other devices.

"Practice of chiropractic" means the adjustment of the twenty-four movable vertebrae of the spinal
column, and assisting nature for the purpose of normalizing the transmission of nerve energy, but does
not include the use of surgery, obstetrics, osteopathy or the administration or prescribing of any drugs,
medicines, serums or vaccines.

452 "Practice of medicine or osteopathic medicine" means the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of453 human physical or mental ailments, conditions, diseases, pain or infirmities by any means or method.

454 "Practice of occupational therapy" means the evaluation, analysis, assessment, and delivery of
455 education and training in activities of daily living (ADL); the design, fabrication, and application of
456 orthoses (splints); guidance in the selection and use of adaptive equipment; therapeutic activities to
457 enhance functional performance; prevocational evaluation and training; and consultation concerning the
458 adaptation of physical environments for individuals who have disabilities.

⁴⁵⁹ "Practice of physical therapy" means, upon medical referral and direction, the evaluation, testing,
treatment, reeducation and rehabilitation by physical, mechanical or electronic measures and procedures
of individuals who, because of trauma, disease or birth defect, present physical and emotional disorders,
but does not include the use of Roentgen rays and radium for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes or the
use of electricity for shock therapy and surgical purposes including cauterization.

464 "Practice of podiatry" means the medical, mechanical and surgical treatment of the ailments of the human foot and ankle, but does not include amputation proximal to the metatarsal-phalangeal joints. The Board of Medicine shall determine whether a specific type of treatment of the foot and ankle is within the scope of practice of podiatry.

468 "Practice of radiologic technology" means the application of x-rays to human beings for diagnostic or469 therapeutic purposes.

470 "Practice of respiratory care" means the (i) administration of pharmacological, diagnostic, and 471 therapeutic agents related to respiratory care procedures necessary to implement a treatment, disease 472 prevention, pulmonary rehabilitative, or diagnostic regimen prescribed by a practitioner of medicine or 473 osteopathic medicine; (ii) transcription and implementation of the written or verbal orders of a 474 practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine pertaining to the practice of respiratory care; (iii) 475 observation and monitoring of signs and symptoms, general behavior, general physical response to respiratory care treatment and diagnostic testing, including determination of whether such signs, 476 477 symptoms, reactions, behavior or general physical response exhibit abnormal characteristics; and (iv) 478 implementation of respiratory care procedures, based on observed abnormalities, or appropriate reporting, 479 referral, respiratory care protocols or changes in treatment pursuant to the written or verbal orders by a 480 licensed practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine or the initiation of emergency procedures, 481 pursuant to the Board's regulations or as otherwise authorized by law. The practice of respiratory care may be performed in any clinic, hospital, skilled nursing facility, private dwelling or other place deemed 482 483 appropriate by the Board in accordance with the written or verbal order of a practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine, and shall be performed under qualified medical direction. 484

"Qualified medical direction" means, in the context of the practice of respiratory care, having readily
accessible to the respiratory care practitioner a licensed practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine
who has specialty training or experience in the management of acute and chronic respiratory disorders
and who is responsible for the quality, safety, and appropriateness of the respiratory services provided
by the respiratory care practitioner.

490 "Radiologic technologist" means an individual, other than a licensed doctor of medicine, osteopathy,

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491 podiatry, or chiropractic, or a dentist licensed pursuant to Chapter 27 (§ 54.1-2700 et seq.) of this title,

492 who (i) performs, may be called upon to perform, or who is licensed to perform a comprehensive scope 493 of diagnostic radiologic procedures employing equipment which emits ionizing radiation and (ii) is

494 delegated or exercises responsibility for the operation of radiation-generating equipment, the shielding of

495 patient and staff from unnecessary radiation, the appropriate exposure of radiographs or other procedures 496 which contribute to any significant extent to the site or dosage of ionizing radiation to which a patient is 497 exposed.

498 "Radiologic technologist, limited" means an individual, other than a licensed radiologic technologist, 499 dental hygienist or *person* who is otherwise authorized by the Board of Dentistry under Chapter 27 of this title and the regulations pursuant thereto, who performs diagnostic radiographic procedures 500 501 employing equipment which emits ionizing radiation which is limited to specific areas of the human 502 body.

503 "Respiratory care" means the practice of the allied health profession responsible for the direct and 504 indirect services, including inhalation therapy and respiratory therapy, in the treatment, management, 505 diagnostic testing, control and care of patients with deficiencies and abnormalities associated with the 506 cardiopulmonary system under qualified medical direction.

507 § 54.1-2901. Exceptions and exemptions generally.

508 The provisions of this chapter shall not prevent or prohibit:

509 1. Any person entitled to practice his profession under any prior law on June 24, 1944, from 510 continuing such practice within the scope of the definition of his particular school of practice;

511 2. Any person licensed to practice naturopathy prior to June 30, 1980, from continuing such practice 512 in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Board;

513 3. Any licensed nurse practitioner from rendering care under the supervision of a duly licensed 514 physician when such services are authorized by regulations promulgated jointly by the Board of 515 Medicine and the Board of Nursing;

4. Any registered professional nurse, registered midwife, licensed nurse practitioner, graduate 516 517 laboratory technician or other technical personnel who have been properly trained from rendering care or 518 services within the scope of their usual professional activities which shall include the taking of blood, 519 the giving of intravenous infusions and intravenous injections, and the insertion of tubes when 520 performed under the orders of a person licensed to practice medicine;

521 5. Any dentist, pharmacist or optometrist from rendering care or services within the scope of his 522 usual professional activities:

523 6. Any practitioner licensed or certified by the Board from delegating to personnel in his personal 524 employ and supervised by him, such activities or functions as are nondiscretionary and do not require 525 the exercise of professional judgment for their performance and which are usually or customarily delegated to such persons by practitioners of the healing arts, if such activities or functions are authorized by and performed for such practitioners of the healing arts and responsibility for such 526 527 528 activities or functions is assumed by such practitioners of the healing arts;

529 7. The rendering of medical advice or information through telecommunications from a physician 530 licensed to practice medicine in Virginia or an adjoining state to emergency medical personnel acting in an emergency situation; 531 532

8. The domestic administration of family remedies;

533 9. The giving or use of massages, steam baths, dry heat rooms, infrared heat or ultraviolet lamps in 534 public or private health clubs and spas;

535 10. The manufacture or sale of proprietary medicines in this Commonwealth by licensed pharmacists 536 or druggists; 537

11. The advertising or sale of commercial appliances or remedies;

538 12. The fitting by nonitinerant persons or manufacturers of artificial eyes, limbs or other apparatus or 539 appliances or the fitting of plaster cast counterparts of deformed portions of the body by a nonitinerant 540 bracemaker or prosthetist for the purpose of having a three-dimensional record of the deformity, when 541 such bracemaker or prosthetist has received a prescription from a licensed physician directing the fitting of such casts and such activities are conducted in conformity with the laws of Virginia; 542

543 13. Any person from the rendering of first aid or medical assistance in an emergency in the absence 544 of a person licensed to practice medicine or osteopathy under the provisions of this chapter;

545 14. The practice of the religious tenets of any church in the ministration to the sick and suffering by 546 mental or spiritual means without the use of any drug or material remedy, whether gratuitously or for 547 compensation;

548 15. Any legally qualified out-of-state or foreign practitioner from meeting in consultation with legally 549 licensed practitioners in this Commonwealth;

550 16. Any practitioner of the healing arts licensed or certified and in good standing with the applicable regulatory agency in another state or Canada when that practitioner of the healing arts is in Virginia 551

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temporarily and such practitioner has been issued a temporary license or certification by the Board from practicing medicine or the duties of the profession for which he is licensed or certified (i) in a summer camp or in conjunction with patients who are participating in recreational activities, (ii) while participating in continuing educational programs prescribed by the Board, or (iii) by rendering at any site any health care services within the limits of his license, voluntarily and without compensation, to any patient of any clinic which is organized in whole or in part for the delivery of health care services without charge as provided in § 54.1-106;

559 17. The performance of the duties of any commissioned or contract medical officer, physical
560 therapist, or podiatrist in active service in the army, navy, coast guard, marine corps, air force, or public
561 health service of the United States while such individual is so commissioned or serving;

562 18. Any masseur, who publicly represents himself as such, from performing services within the scope563 of his usual professional activities and in conformance with state law;

564 19. Any person from performing services in the lawful conduct of his particular profession or 565 business under state law;

20. Any person from rendering emergency care pursuant to the provisions of § 8.01-225;

567 21. Qualified emergency medical personnel, hospital emergency department health care providers or
568 other licensed hospital personnel, when acting within their scope of practice, from following Do Not
569 Resuscitate Orders in accordance with § 54.1-2987.1 and Board of Health regulations;

570 22. Any visiting or home care nurse licensed by the Board of Nursing acting in compliance with the
571 written order of the attending physician not to resuscitate a patient in the event of cardiac or respiratory
572 arrest;

573 23. Any commissioned or contract medical officer of the army, navy, coast guard or air force
574 rendering services voluntarily and without compensation while deemed to be licensed pursuant to
575 § 54.1-106;

576 24. Any provider of a chemical dependency treatment program who is certified as an "acupuncture
577 detoxification specialist" by the National Acupuncture Detoxification Association or an equivalent
578 certifying body, from administering auricular acupuncture treatment under the appropriate supervision of
579 a licensed physician acupuncturist or licensed acupuncturist;

580 25. Any employee of any adult care residence who is certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation
581 (CPR) acting in compliance with the patient's individualized service plan and with the written order of
582 the attending physician not to resuscitate a patient in the event of cardiac or respiratory arrest; or

583 26. Any person working as a health assistant under the direction of a licensed medical or osteopathic
584 doctor within the Department of Corrections, the Department of Juvenile Justice or local correctional
585 facilities; or

27. Any person licensed pursuant to this title from continuing to practice athletic training when such
practice is in accordance with the Board's regulations relating to his scope of practice, any student
athletic trainer from practicing athletic training under the supervision and control of a certified athletic
trainer or the supervision and control of a person who is exempt from athletic trainer certification or
any coach, physical education instructor or person conducting exercise or conditioning programs or
classes from preventing injuries or conditions related to physical activity or recognizing, evaluating or
treating such injuries or conditions immediately upon the onset of such injury or condition.

593 § 54.1-2957.4. Certification as athletic trainer required; requisite training and educational **594** requirements; other powers of the Board.

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to practice or to hold himself out as practicing as an athletic
trainer unless he holds a certificate as an athletic trainer issued by the Board. The Board shall issue
certificates to practice athletic training to applicants for such certification who meet the requirements of
this chapter and the Board's regulations.

599 B. The Board shall establish criteria for the certification of athletic trainers to ensure the 600 appropriate training and educational credentials for the practice of athletic training. Such criteria may 601 include experiential requirements and shall include one of the following: (i) a Virginia testing program 602 to determine the quality of the training and educational credentials for and competence of athletic 603 trainers, (ii) successful completion of a training program and passage of the certifying examination 604 administered by the National Athletic Training Association Board of Certification resulting in 605 certification as an athletic trainer by such national association, or (iii) completion of another 606 Board-approved training program and certifying examination.

607 C. At its discretion, the Board may grant provisional certification to persons who have successfully 608 completed an approved training program or who have met requisite experience criteria established by 609 the Board.

610 D. The Board shall promulgate such regulations as may be necessary for the certification of athletic
611 trainers and the issuance of certificates to athletic trainers to practice in the Commonwealth. The
612 Board's regulations shall ensure the competence and integrity of any person claiming to be an athletic
613 trainer or who engages in the practice of athletic training.

614 § 54.1-2957.5. Advisory Board on Athletic Training established; duties; composition; appointment;
 615 terms.

A. The Advisory Board on Athletic Training shall assist the Board in formulating its requirements for
the certification of athletic trainers. In the exercise of this responsibility, the Advisory Board shall
recommend to the Board the criteria for certification of athletic trainers and the standards of
professional conduct for certificate holders. The Advisory Board shall also assist in such other matters
relating to the practice of athletic training as the Board may require.

B. The Advisory Board shall consist of five members appointed by the Governor for four-year terms.
Three members shall be at the time of appointment athletic trainers who have practiced for not less than
three years, including one athletic trainer practicing at a secondary school, one practicing at an
institution of higher education, and one practicing in a nonacademic environment. One member shall be
a physician licensed to practice medicine in the Commonwealth and one member shall be a citizen
appointed by the Governor from the Commonwealth at large.

627 Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term. No 628 person shall be eligible to serve on the Advisory Board for more than two consecutive terms.

629 § 54.1-2957.6. Exceptions to athletic trainer certification.

A. The requirements for certification of athletic trainers shall not prohibit the recognition,
evaluation, and treatment of injuries or conditions related to physical activity immediately upon the
onset of such injury or condition, or the prevention of injuries or conditions, by any coach, physical
education instructor or person conducting exercise or conditioning programs or classes within the scope
of their employment; nor shall the requirements for certification of athletic trainers prevent student
athletic trainers from practicing athletic training under the supervision and control of a certified athletic
trainer or a person who is otherwise exempt from the athletic certification requirements.

637 B. Notwithstanding the provisions of §§ 54.1-2957.4 and 54.1-2957.5, any person who, prior to June **638** 30, 1999, is employed in Virginia as an athletic trainer, or in the performance of his employment duties

639 engages in the practice of athletic training, shall not be required to obtain a certificate from the Board
640 to continue to be so employed until July 1, 2002.

641 2. That this act shall become effective on January 1, 2000.
