Definitions. 413 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning: "Acupuncturist" means individuals approved by the Board to practice acupuncture. This is limited to 414 415 "licensed acupuncturist" which means an individual other than a doctor of medicine, osteopathy or 416 podiatry, who has successfully completed the requirements for licensure established by the Board (approved titles are limited to: Licensed Acupuncturist, Lic.Ac., and L.Ac.) and "physician 417 418 acupuncturist" which means doctors of medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic and podiatry who have 419 fulfilled the physician requirements for licensure to practice acupuncture established by the Board. 420 "Auricular acupuncture" means the subcutaneous insertion of sterile, disposable acupuncture needles 421 in predetermined, bilateral locations in the outer ear when used exclusively and specifically in the 422 context of an approved chemical dependency treatment program, under the appropriate supervision of a 423 licensed physician acupuncturist or licensed acupuncturist. 424 "Board" means the Board of Medicine. 425 "Healing arts" means the arts and sciences dealing with the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and cure 426 or alleviation of human physical or mental ailments, conditions, diseases, pain or infirmities.
- 427 "Physician assistant" means an individual who has met the requirements of the Board for licensure 428 and who works under the supervision of a licensed doctor of medicine, osteopathy, or podiatry.

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429 "Practice of acupuncture" means the stimulation of certain points on or near the surface of the body 430 by the insertion of needles to prevent or modify the perception of pain or to normalize physiological 431 functions, including pain control, for the treatment of certain ailments or conditions of the body and 432 includes the techniques of electroacupuncture, cupping and moxibustion. The practice of acupuncture 433 does not include the use of physical therapy, chiropractic, or osteopathic manipulative techniques; the 434 use or prescribing of any drugs, medications, herbal preparations, nutritional supplements, serums or 435 vaccines, nor; or the procedure of auricular acupuncture as exempted in § 54.1-2901 when used specifically and exclusively in the context of a publicly supported comprehensive drug treatment 436 437 program by an employee of the program who is trained and approved by the National Acupuncture 438 Detoxification Association.

439 "Practice of athletic training" means the prevention, recognition, evaluation, and treatment of 440 injuries or conditions related to athletic or recreational activity that requires physical skill and utilizes 441 strength, power, endurance, speed, flexibility, range of motion or agility or a substantially similar injury or condition resulting from occupational activity immediately upon the onset of such injury or condition; 442 443 and subsequent treatment and rehabilitation of such injuries or conditions under the direction of a 444 licensed physical therapist and the patient's physician or under the direction of any doctor of medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic, podiatry or dentistry, while using heat, light, sound, cold, electricity, exercise 445 446 or mechanical or other devices.

447 "Practice of chiropractic" means the adjustment of the twenty-four movable vertebrae of the spinal
448 column, and assisting nature for the purpose of normalizing the transmission of nerve energy, but does
449 not include the use of surgery, obstetrics, osteopathy or the administration or prescribing of any drugs,
450 medicines, serums or vaccines.

451 "Practice of medicine or osteopathic medicine" means the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of452 human physical or mental ailments, conditions, diseases, pain or infirmities by any means or method.

453 "Practice of occupational therapy" means the evaluation, analysis, assessment, and delivery of
454 education and training in activities of daily living (ADL); the design, fabrication, and application of
455 orthoses (splints); guidance in the selection and use of adaptive equipment; therapeutic activities to
456 enhance functional performance; prevocational evaluation and training; and consultation concerning the
457 adaptation of physical environments for individuals who have disabilities.

⁴⁵⁸ "Practice of physical therapy" means, upon medical referral and direction, the evaluation, testing,
treatment, reeducation and rehabilitation by physical, mechanical or electronic measures and procedures
of individuals who, because of trauma, disease or birth defect, present physical and emotional disorders,
but does not include the use of Roentgen rays and radium for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes or the
use of electricity for shock therapy and surgical purposes including cauterization.

"Practice of podiatry" means the medical, mechanical and surgical treatment of the ailments of the human foot and ankle, but does not include amputation proximal to the metatarsal-phalangeal joints. The
Board of Medicine shall determine whether a specific type of treatment of the foot and ankle is within the scope of practice of podiatry.

467 "Practice of radiologic technology" means the application of x-rays to human beings for diagnostic or468 therapeutic purposes.

"Practice of respiratory care" means the (i) administration of pharmacological, diagnostic, and 469 470 therapeutic agents related to respiratory care procedures necessary to implement a treatment, disease 471 prevention, pulmonary rehabilitative, or diagnostic regimen prescribed by a practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine; (ii) transcription and implementation of the written or verbal orders of a 472 473 practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine pertaining to the practice of respiratory care; (iii) 474 observation and monitoring of signs and symptoms, general behavior, general physical response to 475 respiratory care treatment and diagnostic testing, including determination of whether such signs, symptoms, reactions, behavior or general physical response exhibit abnormal characteristics; and (iv) 476 477 implementation of respiratory care procedures, based on observed abnormalities, or appropriate reporting, 478 referral, respiratory care protocols or changes in treatment pursuant to the written or verbal orders by a 479 licensed practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine or the initiation of emergency procedures, pursuant to the Board's regulations or as otherwise authorized by law. The practice of respiratory care 480 may be performed in any clinic, hospital, skilled nursing facility, private dwelling or other place deemed 481 appropriate by the Board in accordance with the written or verbal order of a practitioner of medicine or 482 483 osteopathic medicine, and shall be performed under qualified medical direction.

"Qualified medical direction" means, in the context of the practice of respiratory care, having readily
accessible to the respiratory care practitioner a licensed practitioner of medicine or osteopathic medicine
who has specialty training or experience in the management of acute and chronic respiratory disorders
and who is responsible for the quality, safety, and appropriateness of the respiratory services provided
by the respiratory care practitioner.

489 "Radiologic technologist" means an individual, other than a licensed doctor of medicine, osteopathy, podiatry, or chiropractic, or a dentist licensed pursuant to Chapter 27 (§ 54.1-2700 et seq.) of this title,

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491 who (i) performs, may be called upon to perform, or who is licensed to perform a comprehensive scope

492 of diagnostic radiologic procedures employing equipment which emits ionizing radiation and (ii) is 493 delegated or exercises responsibility for the operation of radiation-generating equipment, the shielding of

494 patient and staff from unnecessary radiation, the appropriate exposure of radiographs or other procedures

495 which contribute to any significant extent to the site or dosage of ionizing radiation to which a patient is 496 exposed.

497 "Radiologic technologist, limited" means an individual, other than a licensed radiologic technologist, 498 dental hygienist or *person* who is otherwise authorized by the Board of Dentistry under Chapter 27 of 499 this title and the regulations pursuant thereto, who performs diagnostic radiographic procedures 500 employing equipment which emits ionizing radiation which is limited to specific areas of the human 501 body.

502 "Respiratory care" means the practice of the allied health profession responsible for the direct and 503 indirect services, including inhalation therapy and respiratory therapy, in the treatment, management, 504 diagnostic testing, control and care of patients with deficiencies and abnormalities associated with the cardiopulmonary system under qualified medical direction. 505

506 § 54.1-2957.4. Certification as athletic trainer required; requisite training and educational 507 requirements; powers of the Board concerning athletic training.

508 A. It shall be unlawful for any person to practice or to hold himself out as practicing as an athletic 509 trainer unless he holds a certificate as an athletic trainer ninety days after the effective date of 510 regulations promulgated by the Board implementing athletic trainer certification. The Board shall issue 511 certificates to practice athletic training to applicants for such certification who meet the requirements of 512 this chapter and the Board's regulations.

513 B. The Board shall establish criteria for the certification of athletic trainers to ensure the 514 appropriate training and educational credentials for the practice of athletic training. Such criteria may include experiential requirements and shall include one of the following: (i) a Virginia testing program 515 516 to determine the quality of the training and educational credentials for and competence of athletic 517 trainers, (ii) successful completion of a training program and passage of the certifying examination 518 administered by the National Athletic Training Association Board of Certification resulting in 519 certification as an athletic trainer by such national association, or (iii) completion of another 520 Board-approved training program and certifying examination.

521 C. At its discretion, the Board may grant provisional certification to persons who have successfully 522 completed an approved training program or who have met requisite experience criteria established by 523 the Board. Such provisional certification shall expire as provided for in the regulations of the Board.

524 D. The Board shall promulgate such regulations as may be necessary for the certification of athletic 525 trainers and the issuance of certificates to athletic trainers to practice in the Commonwealth. The 526 Board's regulations shall assure the competence and integrity of any person claiming to be an athletic 527 trainer or who engages in the practice of athletic training.

528 § 54.1-2957.5. Advisory Board on Athletic Training established; duties; composition; appointment; 529 terms.

530 A. The Advisory Board on Athletic Training shall assist the Board in formulating its requirements for 531 the certification of athletic trainers. In the exercise of this responsibility, the Advisory Board shall 532 recommend to the Board the criteria for certification of athletic trainers and the standards of 533 professional conduct for certificate holders. The Advisory Board shall also assist in such other matters 534 relating to the practice of athletic training as the Board may require.

535 B. The Advisory Board shall consist of five members appointed by the Governor for four-year terms. The first appointments shall provide for staggered terms with two members being appointed for a 536 537 two-year term, two members being appointed for a three-year term and one member being appointed for 538 a four-year term. Three members shall be at the time of appointment athletic trainers who have 539 practiced for not less than three years, including one athletic trainer practicing at a secondary school, 540 one practicing at an institution of higher education, and one practicing in a nonacademic environment. 541 One member shall be a physician licensed to practice medicine in the Commonwealth and one member 542 shall be a citizen appointed by the Governor from the Commonwealth at large.

543 Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term. No 544 person shall be eligible to serve on the Advisory Board for more than two full consecutive terms. 545

§ 54.1-2957.6. Exceptions to athletic trainer certification.

546 A. The requirements for certification of athletic trainers shall not prohibit the recognition, 547 evaluation, and treatment of injuries or conditions related to physical activity immediately upon the 548 onset of such injury or condition, or the prevention of injuries or conditions, by any coach, physical 549 education instructor or person conducting exercise or conditioning programs or classes within the scope 550 of their duties as employees or volunteers; nor shall the requirements for certification of athletic 551 trainers prevent student athletic trainers from practicing athletic training under the supervision and

- 552 control of a certified athletic trainer or a person who is otherwise exempt from the athletic certification 553 requirements.
- B. Notwithstanding the provisions of §§ 54.1-2957.4 and 54.1-2957.5, any person who, prior to June 554
- 555 30, 1999, is employed in Virginia as an athletic trainer, or in the performance of his employment duties
- engages in the practice of athletic training, shall not be required to obtain a certificate from the Board to continue to be so employed until July 1, 2002. 556 557
