That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 3 of Title 58.1 an article numbered 9 20.1, consisting of sections numbered 58.1-510 through 58.1-513, as follows: 10 *Article* 20.1. 11 Virginia Land Conservation Incentives Act of 1999. § 58.1-510. Purpose. 12 13 The purpose of this act is to supplement existing land conservation programs to further encourage the preservation and sustainability of Virginia's unique natural resources, wildlife habitats, open spaces 14 15 and forested resources. § 58.1-511. Definitions. 16 17 For the purposes of the article: "Interest in real property" means any right in real property, including access thereto or 18 19 improvements thereon, or water, including but not limited to a fee simple easement, including conservation easement, provided such interest complies with the requirements of the U.S. Internal 20 21 Revenue Code § 170 (h), partial interest, mineral right, remainder or future interest, or other interest or 22 right in real property. 23 "Land" or "lands" means real property, with or without improvements thereon; rights-of-way, water 24 and riparian rights; easements; privileges and all other rights or interests of any land or description in, 25 relating to or connected with real property. 26 "Public or Private Conservation Agency" means any Virginia governmental body, or any private 27 not-for-profit charitable corporation or trust authorized to do business in the Commonwealth and 28 organized and operated for natural resources, land conservation or historic preservation purposes, and 29 having tax-exempt status as a public charity under the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as 30 amended, and having the power to acquire, hold and maintain land and/or interests in land for such 31 purposes. 32 § 58.1-512. Land preservation tax credits for individuals and corporations. 33 A. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2000, there shall be allowed as a credit 34 against the tax liability imposed by §§ 58.1-320 and 58.1-400, an amount equal to fifty percent of the 35 fair market value of any land or interest in land located in Virginia which is conveyed for the purpose of agricultural and forestal use, open space, natural resource, and/or biodiversity conservation, or land, 36 37 agricultural, watershed and/or historic preservation, as an unconditional donation in perpetuity by the 38 landowner/taxpayer to a public or private conservation agency eligible to hold such land and interests 39 therein for conservation or preservation purposes. The fair market value of qualified donations made 40 under this section shall be substantiated by a "qualified appraisal" prepared by a "qualified appraiser," as those terms are defined under applicable federal law and regulations governing charitable 41 42 contributions. 43 B. 1. The amount of the credit that may be claimed by a taxpayer shall not exceed \$50,000 in fiscal 44 year 2000, \$75,000 in fiscal year 2001, and \$100,00 in fiscal year 2002 and thereafter. In addition, in 45 any one taxable year the credit used may not exceed the amount of individual, fiduciary or corporate income tax otherwise due. Any portion of the credit which is unused in any one taxable year may be 46 carried over for a maximum of five consecutive taxable years following the taxable year in which the 47 48 credit originated until fully expended. 49 2. Qualified donations shall include the conveyance in perpetuity of a fee interest in real property or 50 a less-than-fee interest in real property, such as a conservation restriction, preservation restriction, agricultural preservation restriction, or watershed preservation restriction, provided that such 51 less-than-fee interest qualifies as a charitable deduction under § 170 (h) of the U.S. Internal Revenue 52 53 Code of 1986, as amended. Dedications of land for open space for the purpose of fulfilling density

54 requirements to obtain subdivision or building permits shall not be considered as qualified donations

55 under this act.

56 3. Qualified donations shall be eligible for the tax credit herein described if such donations are **SB1218ER**

made to the Commonwealth of Virginia, an instrumentality thereof, or a charitable organization
described in § 501 (c) (3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, if such charitable
organization (i) meets the requirements of § 509 (a) (2) or (ii) meets the requirements of § 509 (a) (3)
and is controlled by an organization described in § 509 (a) (2).

4. The preservation, agricultural preservation, historic preservation or similar use and purpose of
 such property shall be assured in perpetuity.

63 § 58.1-513. Limitations.

A. Any taxpayer claiming a tax credit under this act shall not claim a credit under any similar Virginia law for costs related to the same project. To the extent a credit is taken in accordance with this article, no subtraction allowed for the gain on the sale of (i) land dedicated to open-space use or (ii) an easement dedicated to open-space use under subsection C of § 58.1-322 shall be allowed for three years following the year in which the credit is taken.

B. Any tax credits which arise under this act from the donation of land or an interest in land made 69 70 by a pass-through tax entity such as a trust, estate, partnership, limited liability corporation or 71 partnership, limited partnership, subchapter S corporation or other fiduciary shall be used either by 72 such entity if it is the taxpayer on behalf of such entity or by the member, manager, partner, 73 shareholder and/or beneficiary, as the case may be, in proportion to their interest in such entity in the 74 event that income, deductions and tax liability pass through such entity to such member, manager, 75 partner, shareholder and/or beneficiary or as set forth in the agreement of said entity. Such tax credits 76 shall not be claimed by both the entity and the member, manager partner, shareholder and/or 77 beneficiary for the same donation.

2. That the provisions of this act shall be effective for taxable years beginning on and after January
1, 2000, unless one or more of the events listed in subsection C of § 58.1-3524 has occurred prior to
such date. If any one of these events occurs before January 1, 2000, this act shall not become
effective for taxable years beginning on and after January 1, 2000, but shall instead become effective
for taxable years beginning on and after January 1 of the first year thereafter when none of the

83 events listed in subsection C of § 58.1-3524 have occurred during the immediately preceding calendar 84 year.
