Patron-Newman 8 Referred to Committee on Education and Health 9 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 22.1-253.13:5 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of 11 Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-275.2 as follows: 12 § 22.1-253.13:5. Standard 5. Training and professional development. 13 14 A. The General Assembly and the Board of Education find that effective educational leadership and 15 personnel and appropriate programs of professional development and training are essential for the advancement of public education in the Commonwealth. 16 B. Each member of the Board of Education shall participate in in-service programs on personnel, 17 curriculum and current issues in education as part of his service on the Board. 18 C. Consistent with the finding that leadership is essential for the advancement of public education in 19 20 the Commonwealth, the Board of Education shall develop leadership standards for superintendents and 21 principals. 22 D. The Board of Education shall sponsor, conduct or provide advice on (i) training and professional development of teachers, principals, supervisors, division superintendents and other school staff; (ii) 23 24 in-service programs for school board members on personnel, curriculum and current issues in education; 25 and (iii) in cooperation with the Virginia Department for the Visually Handicapped, in-service programs in Braille for teachers of the blind and visually impaired; and (iv) in cooperation with the Board of 26 27 Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, in-service programs on suicide 28 prevention for licensed administrative and instructional personnel. The Board shall provide technical 29 assistance on professional development to local school boards designed to seek to ensure that all 30 instructional personnel are proficient in the use of educational technology consistent with its Six-Year 31 Educational Technology Plan for Virginia. 32 E. Each local school board shall require (i) its members to participate annually in in-service programs 33 on personnel, curriculum and current issues in education as part of their service on the local board and 34 (ii) require the division superintendent to participate annually in professional development activities at 35 the local, state or national levels. 36 F. Each local school board shall provide (i) a program of professional development, as part of the license renewal process, to assist teachers and principals in acquiring the skills needed to work with 37 38 gifted students and handicapped students and; (ii) a program to increase student achievement, consistent with the relevant Standards of Learning and Standards of Accreditation; (ii)(iii) a program of 39 professional development in educational technology for all instructional personnel; and (iii)(iv) a 40 41 program of professional development for administrative personnel designed to increase proficiency in 42 instructional leadership and management, including in-service training in suicide prevention in accordance with the guidelines developed pursuant to § 22.1-275.2. 43 § 22.1-275.2. Board guidelines. 44 45 The Board of Education shall develop, in cooperation with the Board of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, suicide prevention guidelines for licensed administrative and 46 instructional personnel. These guidelines shall include, but need not be limited to, (i) criteria to assess 47 the suicide risks of students, (ii) characteristics to identify potentially suicidal students, (iii) appropriate **48** 49 responses to students expressing suicidal intentions, (iv) available and appropriate community services for students expressing suicidal intentions, (v) suicide prevention strategies which may be implemented 50 by local schools for students expressing suicidal intentions, (vi) criteria for notification of and 51 discussions with parents of students expressing suicidal intentions, (vii) appropriate sensitivity to 52 53 religious beliefs, and (viii) the legal requirements and criteria for notification of public service agencies, 54 including, but not limited to, the local or state social services and mental health agencies. These guidelines may include case studies and problem-solving exercises and shall be designed as materials 55 for in-service training programs for licensed administrative and instructional personnel. 56

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
