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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 24.2-515 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 5 of Title 24.2 an article numbered 7, consisting of sections numbered 24.2-544 3 4 and 24.2-545, relating to primary elections in presidential election years.

#### 7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That § 24.2-515 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted, and that the Code of 9 Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 5 of Title 24.2 an article numbered 7, consisting of 10 sections numbered 24.2-544 and 24.2-545, as follows:

11 § 24.2-515. Time primaries to be held.

12 Primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election date in 13 November shall be held on the second Tuesday in June next preceding such election, except that beginning with the year 2000 and in presidential election years thereafter, primaries to choose among 14 15 presidential candidates may be held as provided below in Article 7 (§ 24.2-544 et seq.) of this chapter on the last Tuesday in February. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on 16 at the general election date in May shall be held on the first Tuesday in March next preceding such 17 18 election, except that beginning with the year 2000 and in presidential election years thereafter, primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election date in May 19 20 shall be held as described below in Article 7 of this chapter on the last Tuesday in February. 21

Article 7.

#### Presidential Year Primaries.

§ 24.2-544. Time presidential primaries to be held.

24 A. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for the office of President of the United States to be 25 voted on at the November 2000 general election, and the November general election in each presidential 26 election year thereafter, shall be held on the last Tuesday in February preceding the November general 27 election. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for all offices to be voted on at the May 2000 28 general election, and the May general election in each presidential election year thereafter, shall be 29 held on the last Tuesday in February preceding the May general election.

30 B. The provisions of this title shall apply to the conduct of presidential year primaries including the 31 time limits applicable to notices and candidate filing deadlines and the closing of registration records 32 before the primary. The State Board shall provide a schedule for the notices and filing deadlines by the 33 August 1 prior to the February primary including a campaign finance disclosure report filing schedule 34 adjusted to reflect the difference between the June date for other primaries and the February date for 35 the presidential primary, and the March and February primary dates. 36

§ 24.2-545. Presidential primary.

37 A. The duly constituted authorities of the state political party shall have the right to determine the 38 method by which the state party will select its delegates to the national convention to choose the party's 39 nominees for President and Vice President of the United States including a presidential primary or 40 another method determined by the party. The state chairman shall notify the State Board of the party's 41 determination at least ninety days before the primary date. If the party has determined that it will hold 42 a presidential primary to select its delegates to its national convention, each registered voter of the 43 Commonwealth shall be given an opportunity to participate in the presidential primary of the political 44 party, as defined in § 24.2-101, subject to requirements determined by the political party for 45 participation in its presidential primary. The requirements may include, but shall not be limited to, the signing of a pledge by the voter of his intention to support the party's candidate when offering to vote 46 47 in the primary. The requirements applicable to a party's primary shall be determined at least ninety 48 days prior to the primary date and certified to, and approved by, the State Board.

49 B. Any person seeking the nomination of the national political party for the office of President of the 50 United States, or any group organized in this Commonwealth on behalf of, and with the consent of such person, may file with the State Board petitions signed by at least 10,000 qualified voters, including at 51 least 400 qualified voters from each congressional district in the Commonwealth, who attest that they 52 53 intend to participate in the primary of the same political party as the candidate for whom the petitions 54 are filed. Such petitions shall be filed with the State Board by the primary filing deadline. The petitions 55 shall be on a form prescribed by the State Board. Such person or group shall file with the petitions a 56 list of the names of persons who would be elected delegates and alternate delegates to the political

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57 party's national convention if the person wins the primary and the party has determined that its
58 delegates will be selected pursuant to the primary. The slate of delegates and alternates shall comply
59 with the rules of the national and state party.

60 C. The names of all candidates in the presidential primary of each political party shall appear on 61 the ballot in an order determined by lot by the State Board.

D. The State Board shall certify the results of the presidential primary to the state chairman. The
slate of delegates and alternates of the candidate receiving the most votes in the primary shall be
deemed elected by the state party.

E. The election of delegates to a political party's national convention for the nomination of that
party's candidates for President and Vice President of the United States through the presidential
primary process shall be considered to be equivalent to a primary for the nomination of a party's
candidate, and the cost of the presidential primary shall be paid by the counties and cities of the
Commonwealth.
