## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 2.1-20.1:06, relating to participation by part-time state employees in the Commonwealth's health insurance plan. Approved Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 2.1-20.1:06 as follows: § 2.1-20.1:06. Purchase of health insurance coverage by part-time state employees. A. Any part-time state employee employed by the Commonwealth and working twenty or more hours per week for a period of at least six months shall be entitled, upon proper application to the Department of Personnel and Training (the Department), to purchase health insurance coverage for

himself through a health insurance plan administered by the Department. This plan for part-time 12 employees may differ from the other plans sponsored by the Department for state employees and shall 13 14 be exempt from all mandates contained in § 2.1-20.1.

15 B. Applications to purchase health insurance coverage hereunder shall be made on an application form prescribed by the Department. In addition to his application, the applicant shall provide any 16 17 necessary supporting documents requested by the Department.

18 C. Upon payment of the required premiums, coverage shall be effective retroactive to the date of the 19 application.

20 D. The terms, conditions, and costs of health insurance coverage purchased hereunder shall be 21 subject to administration by the Department. The Department may increase the cost of coverage 22 consistent with its administration of the health insurance plans under § 2.1-20.1.

E. Health insurance coverage purchased hereunder shall automatically terminate upon the occurrence of any of the following: (i) the applicant's death, (ii) alternate health insurance coverage 23 24 25 being obtained by the applicant, (iii) the applicant's separation from state service, or (iv) any applicable 26 condition outlined in the policies and procedures of the Department governing its administration of 27 health insurance plans pursuant to § 2.1-20.1.

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
