10	WHEREAS, Virginia is the only state in the country to have opened an entire state park system at
11	one time when it opened six parks covering 19,000 acres in 1936; and
12	WHEREAS, the Department of Conservation and Recreation is responsible for administering 29 state
13	parks and 15 natural areas; and
14	WHEREAS, attendance at Virginia's state parks continues to increase, exceeding 5,000,000 visitors
15	annually; and
16	WHEREAS, the state park system offers a variety of attractions, including small man-made lakes,
17	swimming pools, beaches, and boating access; and
18	WHEREAS, many of these parks are named for the natural resource they feature, such as Smith
19 20	Mountain Lake, Claytor Lake, Natural Tunnel and Twin Lakes State Park; and
20 21	WHEREAS, the Shenandoah Valley is the only region of the Commonwealth without a state park; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of Conservation
23	and Recreation be requested to study the feasibility of including Natural Chimneys and Grand Caverns
24	Regional Parks in the state park system.
25	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Conservation and
26	Recreation for this study, upon request.
27	The Department of Conservation and Recreation shall complete its work in time to submit its

findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 2000 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents. 28
