996478667 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 459** 1 2 Offered January 21, 1999 3 Establishing a joint subcommittee to study the need for a college in South-central Virginia. 4 5 Patrons—Hawkins, Chichester, Couric, Houck, Lucas, Newman, Reynolds, Saslaw, Trumbo and Woods; 6 Delegates: Abbitt, Bennett, Bryant, Byron, Clement, Diamonstein, Dudley, Putney and Ruff 7 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, since Colonial days, Virginians have demonstrated a "thirst for knowledge and a 11 reverence for learning," which resulted in the establishment of schools and universities in the 12 Commonwealth: and 13 WHEREAS, Thomas Jefferson is credited with developing Virginia's plan for a system of public 14 education, which provided for elementary schools, general or secondary schools, and a university; and WHEREAS, with the establishment of the College of William and Mary in 1624 by the crown of 15 England, and with the enactment of legislation appropriating funds for the University of Virginia in 16 February 1818, Virginia was well on its way to creating a high quality and effective system of higher 17 education composed of state-supported colleges and universities; and 18 WHEREAS, today, Virginia's system of higher education includes public and private two- and 19 four-year, comprehensive and doctoral institutions which offer a range of fields and disciplines from the 20 21 associate degree to the post-doctoral level, and educational opportunities in the professional schools; and 22 WHEREAS, it has been the long-standing goal of the Commonwealth to ensure that opportunities for 23 higher education are accessible and available to all citizens in the most practicable, feasible, and 24 cost-efficient manner: and 25 WHEREAS, although the South-central region of the Commonwealth is served by the community 26 college system, there also is the need for a comprehensive or doctoral institution which could be easily 27 accessed by citizens in the area; and 28 WHEREAS, the location of a comprehensive or doctoral institution in South-central Virginia would 29 facilitate economic development, foster community growth, promote the appreciation of the cultural and 30 historical significance of the region and enhance educational opportunities for all citizens through 31 partnerships with public schools, business, government, and other local, state, and federal entities; and 32 WHEREAS, the costs of providing access to the advantages and benefits of a comprehensive or 33 doctoral institution in South-central Virginia need not be prohibitive, as such educational services could 34 be provided on a regional basis; and 35 WHEREAS, the State of Florida has explored the regional university concept to provide greater 36 access to college degree programs in its unserved areas, and the design and approach of Florida and 37 other states in this regard should be considered; and 38 WHEREAS, establishing a comprehensive or doctoral institution in the South-central area would 39 complement Virginia's fine tradition and is consistent with the Commonwealth's legacy and vision to 40 ensure the "broadest diffusion of knowledge"; now, therefore, be it 41 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint subcommittee be established to study the need for a college in South-central Virginia. The joint subcommittee shall be 42 composed of seven members as follows: three members of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate 43 Committee on Privileges and Elections, and four members of the House of Delegates, to be appointed 44 by the Speaker of the House in accordance with the provisions of Rule 16 of the House Rules. 45 In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall review the policies and procedures, if any, for 46 the establishment of colleges in the Commonwealth, including accreditation. An analysis of the 47 South-central region shall also be performed to determine the necessity of establishing a comprehensive **48** or doctoral institution of higher education in the area. Such analysis shall include, but not be limited to, 49 (i) regional demographic characteristics; (ii) the level of education in the region, and high school and 50 51 college graduation rates; (iii) the status of economic development of the South-central region; (iv) the availability of appropriate facilities, space, and grounds for the building or location of a college; (v) the 52 53 availability of qualified professors, instructors, administrators, and staff; (vi) the disciplines which will 54 be offered for study; (vii) the types of degrees that will be conferred; (viii) characteristics of the potential pool of students; (ix) the potential costs of establishing the college; (x) community and local 55 government support for the college; (xi) consultation with the State Council of Higher Education and 56 other relevant entities regarding the establishment of a college; and (xi) such other issues as may be 57 deemed necessary by the joint subcommittee. 58 59 The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$7,800. An estimated \$1,500 is allocated for materials

60 and resources. Such expenses shall be funded from the operational budget of the Clerk of the Senate.

61 The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. Technical assistance 62 shall be provided by the State Council of Higher Education and the staff of the Senate Finance 63 Committee All accentical of the Commonwealth shell provide assistance to the init subcommittee when

63 Committee. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the joint subcommittee, upon

64 request.

65 The joint subcommittee shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations
66 to the Governor and the 2000 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the
67 Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

68 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint

69 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the study.
