Offered January 24, 2000 A BILL to amend and reenact § 10.1-1413.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to closure of landfills.

9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. That § 10.1-1413.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

11 § 10.1-1413.2. Virginia Landfill Clean-up and Closure Fund established; requirements for landfill 12 closure.

13 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 14 Virginia Landfill Clean-up and Closure Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. The Fund shall consist of funds appropriated to it by the 15 General Assembly and such other sums as may be made available to it from any other source, public or 16 17 private, all of which shall be credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the 18 end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the 19 Fund shall be used solely for the purposes described in subsection B. Expenditures and disbursements 20 21 from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written 22 request signed by the Director. This fund shall be exempt from indirect costs assessed by the 23 Department of Accounts.

24 B. The Fund shall be used by the Department solely for the purposes of providing grants to local 25 governments and to political subdivisions which exist to provide solid waste management services for the proper final closure of landfills that are owned by the local governments or political subdivisions, or 26 27 which are located in the locality and have been abandoned in violation of this chapter, and are not 28 equipped with liner and leachate control systems meeting the requirements of the Board's regulations. 29 The Department shall prioritize landfills in need of grants pursuant to this subdivision based on the 30 greatest threat to human health and the environment. Based on that prioritization, the Department shall establish a schedule for the final proper closure by 2010 of landfills that are not equipped with liner 31 32 and leachate control systems meeting the requirements of the Board's regulations. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection N of § 10.1-1408.1, failure by a landfill owner or operator to comply with the schedule established by the Department shall be a violation of this chapter. Grants pursuant to this 33 34 35 subsection shall not replace previously existing financial assurances provided to the Department.

36 C. The Director shall have the authority to access and release moneys in the Fund for purposes of 37 this section for up to \$100,000 per occurrence as long as the disbursement does not exceed the balance 38 of the Fund. If the Director requests a disbursement in excess of \$100,000 or an amount exceeding the 39 current Fund balance, the disbursement shall require the written approval of the Governor.

Disbursements from the Fund may be made for the purposes outlined in subsection B, including, but
not limited to, personnel, administrative, and equipment costs and expenses directly incurred by the
Department, or by any other agency or political subdivision acting at the direction of the Department.

D. The Department shall develop guidelines which, after approval by the Governor, shall determinehow the Fund can be used for the purposes of this section.
