4	Commonwealth University to conduct an epidemiologic survey of the elderly population in Virginia's
5	long-term care facilities to identify the number of patients with suspected Normal Pressure
6 7	Hydrocephalus (NPH) who could benefit from medical therapy.

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12	WHEREAS, life expectancy in the United States has reached a new high of 76.6 years; and
13	WHEREAS, 1998 census estimates indicate that 766,976 Virginians are at least 65 years of age; and
14	WHEREAS, as people live longer, more senior citizens are subject to a brain disease called Normal
15 16	Pressure Hydrocephalus (NPH), which results in dementia, incontinence and gait disturbance; and WHEREAS, the causes and incidence of NPH in the United States are unknown, but senior citizens
17	who become unable to care for themselves and require assistance with activities of daily living from
18	family members or in a nursing facility are at greatest risk; and
19	WHEREAS, if properly diagnosed, this disease can be treated effectively with surgery, and, in many
20	cases, improvement or a complete reversal of symptoms can occur; and
21	WHEREAS, many relatives of individuals with NPH believe the symptoms are a natural consequence
22	of aging, and, therefore, some senior citizens may be admitted to long-term care facilities prematurely at
23 24	great emotional and financial cost; and WHEREAS, approximately 66 percent of nursing home beds in Virginia are occupied by Medicaid
25 25	recipients at an average annual cost of \$30,478 per person; and
26	WHEREAS, proper identification and treatment of persons with NPH could result in significant
27	quality-of-life gains for individuals and reductions in the costs of long-term care; and
28	WHEREAS, research is needed to confirm the incidence of NPH among Virginia's elderly citizens
29	and to develop a cost-effective means of identifying those individuals who are most at risk; and
30 31	WHEREAS, distribution of informational materials to family members and other caregivers of elderly
31 32	persons could help with early identification and treatment of the disease; and WHEREAS, some of the world's leading authorities on the diagnosis and treatment of NPH are

34	Virginia Commonwealth University; now, therefore, be it
35	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Division of Neurological
36	Surgery at the Medical College of Virginia of Virginia Commonwealth University be requested to
37	conduct an epidemiologic survey of the elderly population in Virginia's long-term care facilities to
38 39	identify the number of patients with suspected Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus (NPH) who could benefit
	from medical therapy. The study shall include an initial medical chart review at sample sites; and, based on the chart review, the researchers shall identify a sample population of elderly patients with suspected
41	NPH and confirm the diagnosis with available medical technology. In addition, the researchers shall
42	develop educational tools to inform the public of the disease so that caregivers of patients with NPH
43	symptoms can seek help. Finally, the researchers shall use their findings to assess the potential impact of
44	an expanded program for early detection, diagnosis and treatment on the elderly citizens of the
45	Commonwealth.
46 47	An estimated \$150,000 is allocated for the expenses associated with this study. Such expenses shall be funded by a comparison by the Concered Assembly.
47 48	be funded by a separate appropriation by the General Assembly. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Division of Neurological Surgery
49	at the Medical College of Virginia of Virginia Commonwealth University for this study, upon request.
50	The Division of Neurological Surgery at the Medical College of Virginia of Virginia Commonwealth
51	University shall present its findings and recommendations to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations
52	and Senate Finance Committees by October 1, 2001. The Division shall also submit a report to the
53	Governor and the 2002 General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative
54	Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

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
