4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-5136 of the Code of Virginia, relating to water and waste
5	authority rates and charges.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 15.2-5136 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 15.2-5136. Rates and charges.
13	A. The authority may fix and revise rates, fees and other charges (which shall include, but not be
14	limited to, a penalty not to exceed ten percent on delinquent accounts, and interest on the principal),
15	subject to the provisions of this section, for the use of and for the services furnished or to be furnished
16	by any stormwater control system or water or waste system, or streetlight system in a county having a
17	population between 13,200 and 14,000 according to the 1990 United States Census, or facilities incident
18	thereto, owned, operated or maintained by the authority, or facilities incident thereto, for which the
19	authority has issued revenue bonds as authorized by this chapter. Such rates, fees and charges shall be
20 21	so fixed and revised as to provide funds, with other funds available for such purposes, sufficient at all times (i) to pay the cost of maintaining, repairing and operating the system or systems, or facilities
21 22	incident thereto, for which such bonds were issued, including reserves for such purposes and for
23	replacement and depreciation and necessary extensions, (ii) to pay the principal of and the interest on
24	the revenue bonds as they become due and reserves therefor, and (iii) to provide a margin of safety for
25	making such payments. The authority shall charge and collect the rates, fees and charges so fixed or
26	revised, subject to the jurisdiction of the State Corporation Commission and to any applicable regulation
27	of the State Corporation Commission or law pertaining thereto.
28	B. The rates for water (including fire protection) and sewer service (including disposal) shall be
29 30	sufficient to cover the expenses necessary or properly attributable to furnishing the class of services for which the charges are made. However, the authority may fix rates and charges for the services and
30 31	facilities of its water system sufficient to pay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining its
32	sewer system (including disposal) and all or any part of the principal of or the interest on the revenue
33	bonds issued for such sewer or sewage disposal system, and may pledge any surplus revenues of its
34	water system, subject to prior pledges thereof, for such purposes.
35	C. Rates, fees and charges for the services of a sewer or sewage disposal system shall be just and
36	equitable, and may be based upon:
37	1. The quantity of water used or the number and size of sewer connections;
38 39	2. The number and kind of plumbing fixtures in use in the premises connected with the sewer or sewage disposal system;
<b>40</b>	3. The number or average number of persons residing or working in or otherwise connected with
41	such premises or the type or character of such premises;
42	4. Any other factor affecting the use of the facilities furnished; or
43	5. Any combination of the foregoing factors.
44	However, the authority may fix rates and charges for services of its sewer or sewage disposal system
45	sufficient to pay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining its water system, including
46	distribution and disposal, and all or any part of the principal of or the interest on the revenue bonds
47 48	issued for such water system, and to pledge any surplus revenues of its water system, subject to prior pledges thereof, for such purposes.
49	D. Water and sewer connection fees established by any authority shall be fair and reasonable. Such
50	fees shall be reviewed by the authority periodically and shall be adjusted, if necessary, to assure that
51	they continue to be fair and reasonable. Nothing herein shall affect existing contracts with bondholders
52	which are in conflict with any of the foregoing provisions.
53	E. Rates, fees and charges for the service of a streetlight system shall be just and equitable, and may
54	be based upon:
55	1. The portion of such system used:

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 The portion of such system used;
The number and size of premises benefiting therefrom;
The number or average number of persons residing or working in or otherwise connected with such premises; 56 57 58

59 4. The type or character of such premises;

60 5. Any other factor affecting the use of the facilities furnished; or

61 6. Any combination of the foregoing factors.

However, the authority may fix rates and charges for the service of its streetlight system sufficient topay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining such system.

64 F. The authority may also fix rates and charges for the services and facilities of a water system or a 65 refuse collection and disposal system sufficient to pay all or any part of the cost of operating and maintaining facilities incident thereto for the generation or transmission of power and all or any part of 66 the principal of or interest upon the revenue bonds issued for any such facilities incident thereto, and to 67 68 pledge any surplus revenues from any such system, subject to prior pledges thereof, for such purposes. Charges for services to premises, including services to manufacturing and industrial plants, obtaining all 69 70 or a part of their water supply from sources other than a public water system may be determined by 71 gauging or metering or in any other manner approved by the authority.

G. No sewer, sewage disposal or stormwater control rates, fees or charges shall be fixed under 72 73 subsections A through F until after a public hearing at which all of the users of such facilities; the owners, tenants or occupants of property served or to be served thereby; and all others interested have 74 75 had an opportunity to be heard concerning the proposed rates, fees and charges. After the adoption by the authority of a resolution setting forth the preliminary schedule or schedules fixing and classifying 76 77 such rates, fees and charges, notice of a public hearing, setting forth the proposed schedule or schedules 78 of rates, fees and charges, shall be given by two publications, at least six days apart, in a newspaper 79 having a general circulation in the area to be served by such systems at least sixty days before the date fixed in such notice for the hearing. The hearing may be adjourned from time to time. A copy of the 80 81 notice shall be mailed to the governing bodies of all localities in which such systems or any part thereof is located. After the hearing the preliminary schedule or schedules, either as originally adopted or as 82 83 amended, shall be adopted and put into effect.

H. No refuse collection and disposal rates, fees or charges shall be fixed under subsections A through 84 85 F until after a public hearing at which all of the users of such facilities; the owners, tenants or 86 occupants of property served or to be served thereby; and all others interested have had an opportunity 87 to be heard concerning the proposed rates, fees and charges. After the adoption by the authority of a resolution setting forth the preliminary schedule or schedules fixing and classifying such rates, fees and 88 89 charges, notice of a public hearing, setting forth the proposed schedule or schedules of rates, fees and 90 charges, shall be given by a single publication in a newspaper having a general circulation in the area to 91 be served by such systems at least fifteen days before the date fixed in such notice for the hearing. The 92 hearing may be adjourned from time to time. A copy of the notice shall be mailed to the governing bodies of all localities in which such systems or any part thereof is located. After the hearing the 93 94 preliminary schedule or schedules, either as originally adopted or as amended, may be adopted and put 95 into effect.

96 I. A copy of the schedule or schedules of the final rates, fees and charges fixed in accordance with 97 subsection G or H shall be kept on file in the office of the clerk or secretary of the governing body of 98 each locality in which such systems or any part thereof is located, and shall be open to inspection by all 99 interested parties. The rates, fees or charges so fixed for any class of users or property served shall be extended to cover any additional properties thereafter served which fall within the same class, without 100 101 the necessity of a hearing or notice. Any increase in any rates, fees or charges under this section shall 102 be made in the manner provided in subsection G. Any other change or revision of the rates, fees or 103 charges may be made in the same manner as the rates, fees or charges were originally established as 104 provided in subsection G or H.
