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## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 396**

Establishing the Virginia-North Carolina Interstate High-Speed Rail Commission.

WHEREAS, levels of congestion on interstate highways and at major airports all along the east coast of the United States are rapidly rising, and in some locations have reached virtual gridlock for hours each day; and

12 WHEREAS, it is thus highly desirable that, to the maximum degree possible, alternative modes of 13 transportation be used to move people and goods long distances along the east coast corridor; and

14 WHEREAS, preliminary engineering studies have documented that the creation of high-speed passenger rail service between points in Virginia and points in North Carolina could provide travelers all 15 along the corridor an attractive alternative to highway travel, thus reducing highway congestion; and 16

WHEREAS, establishment of high-speed passenger rail service between Virginia and North Carolina 17 18 offers the additional possibility of connection through the District of Columbia to origins and 19 destinations as far north as New England; and

20 WHEREAS, establishment of high-speed passenger service between Virginia and North Carolina 21 offers the possibility of connections to additional destinations in the south, including Florida, 22 Greenville-Spartanburg, South Carolina, Atlanta, Georgia, and others; and

23 WHEREAS, it would appear both useful and prudent to have a panel of legislators from both 24 Virginia and North Carolina established in order to explore the benefits, costs, and required legislative 25 actions associated with establishing this service; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That there be hereby established the 26 27 Virginia-North Carolina Interstate High-Speed Rail Commission. The Virginia component of the Commission shall consist of six members as follows: two members of the Senate, to be appointed by the 28 29 Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections, and four members of the House of Delegates, to be 30 appointed by the Speaker of the House, in accordance with the principles of proportional representation 31 found in the Rules of the House of Delegates.

32 In conducting its study, the Commission shall conduct such meetings, tours of inspection, and public 33 hearings as to them may appear appropriate to determine the desirability and feasibility of establishing 34 high-speed passenger rail service between Virginia and North Carolina. If it appears to the Commission desirable and feasible that such service be established, they shall consider and recommend to the 35 36 Governor and General Assembly legislative actions necessary to do so, including identification of 37 necessary levels of funding and sources of such funds. 38

The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$7,500 per year.

The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. Technical assistance 39 shall be provided by the Department of Rail and Public Transportation. All agencies of the 40 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request. 41

The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the 42 43 Governor and the 2003 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division 44 of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.

45 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the 46 47 study.

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
