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11	WHEREAS, natural gas customers' bills have increased in recent months, due in part to a colder
12	winter and an imbalance between supply and demand; and
13	WHEREAS, low wellhead prices for natural gas in 1998 and 1999 contributed to a decline in the
14 15	number of working rigs for natural gas; and WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's investor-owned natural gas utilities indicate that they do not profit
16	from the cost of natural gas purchased for customers' usage; and
17	WHEREAS, the State Corporation Commission reviews investor-owned natural gas utilities' gas
18	purchase contract for prudence; and
19 20	WHEREAS, the availability of reliable, reasonably priced sources of energy is critical to the continued health of the Commonwealth's economy and to the well-being of its citizens; and
2 0 2 1	WHEREAS, the American economy is becoming increasingly dependent on imported foreign oil to
22	meet its growing energy needs; and
23	WHEREAS, it is critically important for the nation and Virginia to develop energy policy that
24 25	promotes domestic energy supply; and WHEREAS, the federal government is devoting itself to a comprehensive energy strategy, so too
23 26	should the Commonwealth; and
27	WHEREAS, efforts to increase the severance tax on Virginia-produced natural gas, in addition to
28	other policies that are not conducive to Virginia natural gas production, diminish the availability of
29 30	natural gas produced in Virginia; and WHEREAS, natural gas as a domestic energy source should be promoted as a clean, safe, efficient,
30 31	and reliable fuel; and
32	WHEREAS, the recent fluctuations in natural gas prices indicates that market forces are attempting
33	to balance supply and demand; now, therefore, be it
34 35	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the State Corporation Commission be requested to study the reasons for the recent increase in the price of natural gas. The
36	study shall also include recommended actions at the national and state levels that will increase available
37	natural gas supplies, thereby promoting the affordability of natural gas as an efficient domestic energy
38	source. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Commission by the Department of Mines, Minerals,
39 10	and Energy.
40 41	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission for this study, upon request.
42	The State Corporation Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and
43	recommendations to the Governor and the 2001 Session of the General Assembly by October 20, 2001,
44 45	and as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing
45	of legislative documents.

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
