4. **Title** Records to be kept by pawnbrokers

5. **Summary/Purpose:**

The bill permits pawnbrokers to maintain at their places of business an electronic record of each transaction involving goods, articles or things pawned or pledged which shall be made available to law enforcement officers upon request. Such electronic record must be maintained for a minimum of one year. Bill also permits pawnbrokers, who elect to participate in electronic format, to charge a service fee for each loan or transaction not to exceed five percent of the amount loaned on each item or three dollars, whichever is less. The bill also provides for the use of the electronic format in the daily report to police agencies and requires the Department of State Police to adopt regulations under the Administrative Process Act for the uniform reporting of information required by this section.

8. **Fiscal implications:**

This bill will require the Department of State Police to adopt regulations under the Administrative Process Act to develop the electronic format for submission of the daily reports from the pawnbrokers to local police agencies and the format for record retention. The Department of State Police also will need to revise the pawnbroker's regulations brochure. This bill will have minimal fiscal impact on the Department of State Police, and costs are related to the reprinting of the pawnbroker's brochure, promulgating the administrative regulations and for related mailings.
