4. Title Open burning.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Allows prescribed burns conducted to (i) control exotic and invasive plants, (ii) establish and maintain wildlife habitat, or (iii) manage natural heritage resources throughout the entire day during the period February 15 through March 1. The current law limits open burning to between 4:00 p.m. and midnight from February 15 through April 30. However, in order to be exempted from the current law, the burn has to be conducted in accordance with a prescribed burning plan approved by the State Forester prior to February 1 and managed by a certified burn manager. The bill also gives the State Forester the authorization to revoke approval of a prescribed burn if hazardous fire conditions exist on the day of a planned burn and to revoke the certification of any prescribed burn manager who violates the provisions of the section.
