11. Other comments: The General Assembly or the Commonwealth Transportation Board has the statutory authority to name Highways and Bridges that form a part of the systems of State Highways.

Mr. Everett H. Hogge, who passed away on April 4, 1988, was a member of the General Assembly representing the 93rd House District.

Mr. Hogge served on the Newport News City Planning Commission from 1984 to 1988.

There is a \$400 cost to VDOT for the fabrication and installation of two signs. This cost can be absorbed within VDOT's operating budget. The bill as written would differ from the Commonwealth Transportation Board's practice of requiring an affected locality or localities to pay for the fabrication and installation of signs for naming a highway or bridge.
