To designate U. S. Alternate Route 58 Between the community of Hansonville in Russell County and the City of Norton in Wise County as the "Senator M. M. Long Highway."

**11. Other comments:** The General Assembly or the Commonwealth Transportation Board has the statutory authority to name Highways and Bridges that form a part of the systems of State Highways.

The cost to VDOT includes the fabrication and installation of twelve signs and will be absorbed in normal operations. The bill as written would differ from the Commonwealth Transportation Board's practice

of requiring an affected locality or localities to pay for the fabrication and installation of signs for naming a highway or bridge.

An amendment will be offered to more clearly define the location of the designation.
