10	traditions, have enriched immeasurably the social and cultural diversity of the Commonwealth and the
11	nation; and
12	WHEREAS, Asian/Pacific Americans are one of the fastest growing segments of the American
13	population, increasing in number from fewer than 1.5 million in 1970 to more than 10.5 million in
14	2000; and
15	WHEREAS, Asian/Pacific Americans have succeeded in government, business, technology, and the
16	arts, vastly enriching the cultural landscape of Virginia and the nation; and
17	WHEREAS, diversity is one of Virginia's greatest strengths, and recognizing the accomplishments
18	and contributions of Asian/Pacific Americans emphasizes the importance of inclusion in the well-being
19	of the Commonwealth; and
20	WHEREAS, by proclamation, President George W. Bush proclaimed May 2001 as national
21	Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month; now, therefore, be it
