10 WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was Gary F. Smith of Fairfax, a retired Army 11 lieutenant colonel and the chief of Army Retirement Services; and

WHEREAS, during his 23 years in the United States Army, Gary F. Smith served in Italy, the 12 Netherlands, and Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and earned a Soldier's Medal for heroism while serving in 13 14 Vietnam: and 15

WHEREAS, in 1992 Lieutenant Colonel Smith became head of the Army Retirement Services; and

16 WHEREAS, a resident of the Mount Vernon section of Fairfax County since 1984, Gary F. Smith 17 was married and the father of four daughters and was well-known in the community for his skill and dedication as a coach of youth basketball and soccer; now, therefore, be it 18

19 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly note with sadness the loss of Lieutenant Colonel Gary F. Smith, a victim of the September 11 terrorist attacks on 20 21 the United States; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 22 23 for presentation to the family of Lieutenant Colonel Gary F. Smith as an expression of the heartfelt 24 condolences of the General Assembly of Virginia.
