HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 312

On the death of Mark Ryan McGinly.

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, terrorists launched a violent attack on the United States, causing great destruction and horrible human suffering in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the attack had a devastating effect in Virginia, home of the Pentagon and of many of the people killed, injured, or missing in Virginia and New York; and

WHEREAS, among the victims of the attack on New York City was Mark Ryan McGinly of Vienna, an employee of Carr Futures on the 92nd floor of the World Trade Center; and

WHEREAS, Mark McGinly, whose family resides in Vienna, was a graduate of James Madison High School and Bucknell University; and

WHEREAS, a lifelong golfer, Mark McGinly was captain of his high school and college golf teams; and

WHEREAS, a popular, talented, and personable young man of 26, Mark McGinly will be remembered and honored by his loving family and his countless friends and colleagues in New York and Virginia; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly note with sadness the loss of Mark Ryan McGinly, an innocent victim of the September 11 terrorist attacks on the United States; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to the family of Mark Ryan McGinly as an expression of the heartfelt condolences of the General Assembly of Virginia.
