WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, terrorists launched an inexcusable attack on the United States, causing great destruction and horrible human suffering in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the attack had a devastating effect in Virginia, home of the Pentagon and of many of the personnel, military and civilian, who served there; and

WHEREAS, among the victims of the Pentagon attack was Brady K. Howell of Arlington, a management intern in the office of the Chief of Naval Operations; and

WHEREAS, a political science graduate of Utah State University, Brady Howell had recently completed a master's degree in public administration from Syracuse University; and

WHEREAS, the holder of a prestigious Presidential Management Internship, Brady Howell was assigned to a small, tightly knit, and highly select group that tracked threats for the Chief of Naval Operations; and

WHEREAS, Brady Howell and six of his colleagues in the Chief of Naval Operations Intelligence Plot were in a meeting in an office that was at ground zero when American Airlines Flight 77 struck the Pentagon; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of Brady K. Howell, an innocent victim of the September 11 terrorist attacks on the United States; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to the family of Brady K. Howell as an expression of the heartfelt condolences of the General Assembly of Virginia.
