12 13	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13 14	1. That §§ 8, 10, 11, and 12 of the first enactment of Chapter 704 of the Acts of Assembly of 1999 and §§ 1, 13, 14 and 15 of the first enactment of Chapter 704 of the Acts of Assembly of 1999, as
15	amended by Chapters 910 and 983 of the Acts of Assembly of 2000, are amended and reenacted as
16	follows:
17	§ 1. That, in lieu of the provisions of § 2.2-3708, (i) any public body, as defined in § 2.2-3701, (a)
18	in the legislative branch of state government or (b) responsible to or under the supervision, direction, or
19	control of the Secretary of Commerce and Trade pursuant to § 2.2-204 or the Secretary of Technology
20	pursuant to § 2.2-225, or (ii) the State Board for Community Colleges established in § 23-215, shall be
21	authorized to hold meetings via electronic communication means pursuant to this act.
22	§ 8. Notice for electronic communication meetings continued more than seven days after the meeting
23	date shall be in the same manner as required by § 6. Notice for electronic communication meetings
24	continued less than seven days from the meeting date to (i) address an emergency or (ii) conclude the
25	agenda of the electronic communication meeting, shall be made during the meeting prior to adjournment
26	and shall include the date, time, place, and general purpose of the continued meeting. The basis for the
27	emergency shall be stated during the meeting prior to adjournment and included in the minutes of the
28	meeting, if minutes are required by § 2.1-343 2.2-3707.
29 30	§ 10. Votes taken during any meeting conducted through electronic communication means pursuant to this act shall be recorded by name in roll-call fashion and included in the minutes of the meeting, if
30 31	minutes are required by § 2.2-3707.
32	§ 11. Any public body or the Board, when conducting an electronic communication meeting pursuant
33	to this act, shall make an audio/visual recording of the meeting. The recording shall be preserved by the
34	public body or the Board for a period of three years from the date of the meeting and shall be available
35	to the public for inspection and copying pursuant to the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.1-340
36	2.2-3700 et seq.).
37	§ 12. It shall be a violation of this act for any entity listed in § 1, or any members of such entities,
38	to use the provisions of this act to violate the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.1-340 2.2-3700
39	et seq.) to discuss or act upon any matters over which such entities have supervision, control,
40	jurisdiction, authority, or advisory powers.
41	§ 13. By April 15, 2001 2003, public bodies in the legislative branch of state government which
42 43	conduct electronic communication meetings pursuant to this act shall file with the Joint Rules
43 44	Committee, as defined in § 51.1-124.3, a report on the total number of electronic communication meetings held; the dates and purposes of the meetings; the types of electronic communication means by

46	meetings; and a summary of any public comment received about the electronic communication meetings.
47	§ 14. By April 15, 2001 2003, public bodies responsible to or under the supervision, direction, or
48	control of the Secretary of Commerce and Trade pursuant to § 2.1-51.40 2.2-204 or the Secretary of
49	Technology pursuant to § 2.1-51.46 2.2-225, which conduct electronic communication meetings pursuant
50	to this act shall file with the Secretary of Commerce and Trade or the Secretary of Technology,
51	respectively, a report on the total number of electronic communication meetings held; the dates and
52	purposes of the meetings; the types of electronic communication means by which the meetings were
53	held; the number of participants, including the members of the public, at the meetings; and a summary
54	of any public comment received about the electronic communication meetings.
