1 **SENATE BILL NO. 490** 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 34 56 7 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health on January 31, 2002) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Newman) A BILL to provide for the authorization and acceptance of certain certificate of public need applications. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 **1**. § 1. Certain certificate of public need applications authorized. A. Notwithstanding the provisions of § 32.1-102.3:2 or the provisions of any current Request For Applications (RFAs) issued by the Commissioner of Health pursuant to § 32.1-102.3:2, the 10 11 Commissioner of Health shall reissue a Request For Applications for sixty new nursing home or nursing 12 facility beds in Planning District 11 when (i) pursuant to the 1997 determination of a 240-nursing home 13 bed need in Planning District 11 and the issuance by the Commissioner of Health of the formal legal 14 15 notice of Request For Certificate of Public Need Applications, a certificate of public need for sixty new 16 nursing home or nursing facility beds was issued to an existing nursing home in Planning District 11, and (ii) the sixty-bed certificate of public need issued pursuant to the 1997 Request For Applications for 17 Planning District 11 to such nursing home has been formally surrendered by the company owning such 18 19 nursing home because of lack of the requisite financing. 20 The Commissioner shall authorize and accept applications for such sixty nursing home or nursing 21 facility beds and may issue one or more certificates of public need for an increase of such sixty new 22 beds in which nursing facility or extended care services are to be provided to existing facilities within 23 Planning District 11. The Commissioner shall give preference in reissuing any certificate of public need 24 for these sixty beds to facilities located in a rapid-growth area of Planning District 11. 25 B. Further, notwithstanding the provisions of § 32.1-102.3:2 or the provisions of any current Request 26 For Applications (RFAs) issued by the Commissioner of Health pursuant to § 32.1-102.3:2, the Commissioner of Health shall also reissue a Request For Applications for 120 new nursing home or 27 28 nursing facility beds in Planning District 13 when (i) pursuant to the 1997 determination of a 29 240-nursing home bed need in Planning District 13 and the issuance by the Commissioner of Health of 30 the formal legal notice of Request For Certificate of Public Need Applications, a certificate of public need for 120 new nursing home or nursing facility beds was issued to a for-profit nursing home 31 operating company incorporated in January 1973, and (ii) such 120-bed certificate of public need issued 32 pursuant to the 1997 Request For Applications for Planning District 13 to such nursing home corporation was scheduled for completion by April 2000; however, the company awarded this 120-bed 33 34 35 certificate of public need has not started construction because of lack of the requisite financing and, 36 thus, the relevant certificate of public need has expired. 37 The Commissioner shall authorize and accept applications for such 120 nursing home or nursing 38 facility beds and may issue one or more certificates of public need for an increase of such 120 new 39 beds in which nursing facility or extended care services are to be provided to existing or proposed new 40 facilities within Planning District 13. The Commissioner shall give preference in reissuing any 41 certificate of public need for these 120 beds to proposals to locate these new beds in western 42 Mecklenburg County in the areas with the largest quantified need according to the 1997 projections, with highest priority granted to the northwest corner of Mecklenburg County in or about the area of 43 Chase City, which is located at the intersection of Routes 47, 49 and 92 and second priority granted to 44 the southwest corner of Mecklenburg County in or about the area of Clarksville, which is located near 45 the intersection of Routes 15, 49, and 58. The Commissioner shall take due note in issuing such 46 47 certificates of need to (a) the high occupancy rates within Planning District 13 over the period of 1994 to 1996, (b) the finding that Mecklenburg County has the lowest ratio of nursing facility beds per **48** elderly population in Planning District 13, and (c) the finding that Mecklenburg County has a 49 50 significant population of older adults and will continue to experience growth in its older adult 51 population.

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
