8. Fiscalimplications: Although this legislation will have fiscal implications, it is impossible to determine the degree of the fiscal impact at this time. Currently the compensation for any attorney or guardian additemappointed by the court for an indigent respondent is borne by the Common wealth, however, the cost of the attorney representing the petitioner is not. According to the 2000 Virginia State of the Judiciary Report, the rewere 539 proceedings seeking the appointment of a guardian or conservator in the 2000 calendary ear. The average paid to the guardian addit eminthese cases was \$517. For the purpose of this analysis, if the same average payment is made to the attorney for the petitioner in half of the cases, the fiscal impact would be \$139,331. The General Assembly did not provide any funding for this legislation.
