Currently, localities may provide special benefits for lawen forcement of ficers with benefits equivalent to those of state police of ficers (LEOS) to deputies. Seventy - three localities have made this election. If VaLORS is mandated at local expense, the aggregate cost will be approximately \$36.3 million in FY04, less the amount currently being paid in additional contributions by the localities currently providing LEOS.

10. Technicalamendmentnecessary: Yes. Because VaLORS currently has only state employees as members, its members are included by Codereference in the eVirginia Sickness and Disability Program (VSDP). This bills hould be a mended to incorporate § 51.1 - 1100 and then to insert under the definition of "eligible employee", after § 51.1 - 212, except for a deputy sheriff would then clarify that deputy she riffs are not eligible for a benefit currently available to only state employees.		
11. Othercomments: This would be the first group of local employees allowed into VaLORS. Also, because she riffs are mandated to participate in LEOS, she riffs and deputies would have different benefit structures. This bill is similar, but not the same as SB80 and HB946.		

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
