- odeofVirginia, andtoamendtheCodeofVirginiabyaddingsectionsnumbered46.2 -341.18:1,46.2 -341.20:1, and 46.2 - 341.20:2, to provide for the disqualification of a person holding a commercialdriver'slice nseforcertainalcohol -relatedoffensescommittedinotherstates wheredisqualificationwasimposedthroughaciviloradministrativehearingwithoutany courtproceedings. The bill further provides for disqualification of a commercial driver's license holderfor60daysforviolationscommittedatrailroad/highwaygradecrossings. Longerdisqualifications are authorized for repeat of fenses. In addition, it authorizes the impositionofcivilpenaltiesupto\$10,000foremployerswhoalloworrequirean employeeto operateacommercialmotorvehicleinviolationofanylaworregulationpertainingto railroad/highwaygradecrossingsandprovidesthatnocourtmayreduce, dismiss, ordefer the convictionofapersonchargedwithanyoffensecommittedwhil eoperatingacommercial motorvehiclebecausethepersonhasattendedadriverimprovementclinic.

- 8. Fiscalimplications: Thefiscalimpactofthislegislationcoul dbesignificant. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) advises that his proposal will put Virginia in compliance with federal commercial driver's licenses (CDL) statutes and regulations. It further advises that noncompliance with such federal laws may result in Virginia being denied the ability to issue CDLs, and will result in the loss of, not the transfer of (i) federal highway funds in the amounts of 5% (or \$20.7 million) the first fiscally ear and 10% (or \$41.4 million) each fiscally ear thereafter, and (ii) an unknown amount, possibly up to 50% (or approximately \$1.8 million), of Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) funds allocated to the Virginia State Police.

Inaddition,thelegislationcallsforcivilpenaltiesofupto\$10,000for employerswhoallow orrequireanemployeetooperateacommercialmotorvehicleinviolationofanylawor regulationpertainingtorailroad/highwaygradecrossings. It further stipulates that no court may reduce, dismiss, or defer the conviction of ape rson charged with any offense committed while operating a commercial motor vehicle because the person has attended a driver improvement clinic. The sepenal ties could be viewed as an additional source of revenue for the Transportation Trust Fund, though no estimate is available regarding the potential amount that may be collected.
