## 8. Fiscalimplications:

Federallawrequiresthatintheabsenceofabillofthisnature, 1.5 percent of all federal highway construction funds be diverted to a highways a fetyprogram. Since the open container legislation was not passed during the 2001 session, \$6.2 million of 2001 highway construction funds will be diverted to highways a fetyprograms. I tisimportant to note that the percentage transfer will double in FY 03 to 3 percent. As a result, the diverted amount from highway construction to highways a fetyprogram swill increase to \$12.4 million in FY 03 and FY 04.

Therecould be additional revenue generated from the \$25 civil penalty, but the amount cannot be determined. Any additional revenue would be deposited to the Traffic Safety Fund.
