5. Summary/Purpose:

Thislegislationproposestoamendand reenact§§9.1 -101,9 -1.102,9.1- 110,9.1- 184,15.2-1737, and 19.2 -13 of the Code of Virginia, and to a mend the Code of Virginia by adding a sectionnumbered22.1 -280.2:1,todefineaschoolresourceofficerasatrained,certifiedlaw enforcementofficer hiredbyalocallaw -enforcementagencytoprovidelaw -enforcementand securityservicestoVirginiapublicelementaryandsecondaryschoolsandaschoolsecurity officerasanindividualwhoisemployedbythelocalschoolboardforthesingularpurposeo f maintaining order and discipline, preventing crime, investigating violations of school board policies.anddetainingandapprehendingpersonsviolatingthelaworschoolboardpolicieson schoolpropertyoratschool -sponsoredeventsandwhoisresponsib lesolelyforensuringthe safety, security, and welfare of all students, faculty, staff, and visitors in the assigned school. The measure also directs the Department of Criminal Justice Services, in consultation with theDepartmentofEducationandtheV irginiaStateCrimeCommission,toestablishcompulsory minimumstandardsforemploymentandjob -entryandin -servicetrainingcurriculaand certificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficers;thetrainingandcertificationwillbe administeredbythe VirginiaCenterforSchoolSafety.Schoolsecurityofficersareprecluded from appointment as conservators of the peace and as special police of ficers. A second enactmentclauseprovidesthatthetrainingandemploymentstandardswillbeapplicableto personsemployedasschoolsecurityofficersonandafterSeptember15,2003.

Fiscalimplications: ThelegislationdirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices (DCJS)todevelop,inconjunctionwiththeDepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaState CrimeCommission,thecomp ulsoryminimumstandardsforemployment,in -servicetraining andcertificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficersandchargestheVirginiaCenterfor SchoolSafetywithadministeringtheapplicationofthosestandards.Thedepartmentadvises thati twouldrequireapproximately\$300,000andtwoFTEtomeettherequirementsofthe

legislation, as the Virginia Center for School Safety has been largely unfunded since its inception.

TheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServicesadvisesthatitisimporta nttonotethatitis awarethatbudgetamendmentsfor\$615,730andthreeFTEforeachyearoftheupcoming bienniumhavebeenintroducedtofullyfundtheCenter.Ifthoseamendmentspass,the agencywillhavesufficientresourcestomeettherequirement softhislegislationandtheother mandatesoftheCenter.

TheDepartmentofEducationadvises that while the legislation calls for the development of standards, it states that local school boards may hire school security officers and school resource of ficers but does not compete them to, therefore there is no fiscal impact.
