According to DMAS, the rate for the facility outlined in this legislation would be about \$100.43 per day in FY2004 based on the nursing facility calculation formula. This formula accounts for factors such as peer groupings, direct and indirect costs, and capital rate for a new facility. Therefore, DMAS estimates it would be required to expend \$3,978,745 (\$1,959,134 GF and \$2,019,611 federal match) each year for the additional beds.
