- 6 WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh of Alexandria, an avid community supporter who was active in 7 civic affairs and adept at politics, died December 24, 2002; and
- WHEREAS, a native of Wisconsin and a graduate of the University of Wisconsin, Lois Van 8 9 Valkenburgh came to the Washington, D.C. area in 1948; and

10 WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh was a member of the League of Women Voters beginning in the early 1940s and was instrumental in producing Alexandria's first voter's guide; and 11

WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh managed several Virginia congressional and General Assembly 12 13 election campaigns; and

- 14 WHEREAS, always engaged in politics and issues concerning the community, Lois Van Valkenburgh 15 worked in support of education and school desegregation; and
- WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh was an invaluable and longtime legislative aide to Delegate 16 Mary Marshall of Arlington in the 1970s; and 17
- 18 WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh served on the Virginia Mental Health and Retardation Board and 19 was honored by the National Council of Community Mental Health Centers; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh was an organizer and officer of the Friends of the Alexandria 21 Community Mental Health Center and chairman and legislative liaison for the Alexandria Commission 22 on Aging; and
- 23 WHEREAS, a board member of the Alexandria Volunteer Bureau, Lois Van Valkenburgh was 24 honored for her contributions to the 1998 Aging Expo, as well as for her work on the annual Alexandria 25 Walk to Fight Breast Cancer; and
- WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh was founder and chairman of the Alexandria Community 26 27 Services Board and was honored in 1990 for 30 years of volunteer work with people who suffered from 28 mental disabilities and substance abuse problems; and
- 29 WHEREAS, a benevolent and passionate community advocate, Lois Van Valkenburgh was honored 30 by the American Red Cross and the Alexandria Commission on Women; and
- 31 WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh served on the executive board of Alexandria's United Way and received the outstanding citizenship award for her generous community service; and 32 33
 - WHEREAS, Lois Van Valkenburgh will be sorely missed and fondly remembered by her family, her countless friends and admirers, and the residents of the Alexandria community; now, therefore, be it
- 35 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly mourn 36 the passing of an outstanding Virginian, Lois Van Valkenburgh; and, be it
