"Stillbirth"isdefinedasanunintended, intrauterinedeath thatoccursafterthe20thweekofpregnancytobirth. The "stillborninfant"isbornwithout anya ttemptatrespiration, includingabeatingumbilicalcord. Currently, the Commonwealth issuesonlyabirthcertificateordeathcertificatethatisreported to the Registrarasafetal deathreport. Anumber of stateshave created this form of certificate eof birthasapart of the "Missing Angel Act." The bill directs the Board of Health to prescribeare as on able fee to cover the administrative cost and preparation of the certificate.

Budgetamendmentnecessary: Yes,forone -timecostsinFY2004.TheVitalRecords programdoesnothaveenoughcapacityinitsannualappropriationstoabsorbtheone -time costsassociatedwiththisbill.Theone -timeappropriationofgeneralfunddollarsorspecial fundrevenueintheVitalRecordsAutomationFundinItem309(VitalRecordsandHealth Statistics –Program40400)wouldbenecessary.

8. Fiscalimplications:

The Virginia Department of Health's Office of Vital Records would incurone -time costs of between \$25,000 and \$35,000 in order to meet the bill's provisions. The seone -time costs include the revision of the fetal death certificate to include elective fields for both the still born fetus' name and the father. The form currently only includes the mother's name. The agency's vital records database would also have to be modified in order to facilitate such requests, including the bill's provisions concerning delayed certificate requests of over one year from July 1,2003 on.

The charge for fetal death certificates could then be established at the same rate as other certificates to address the direct costs associated within dividual requests.
