- 6. FiscalImpactisINDERTERMINATE.However,itisexpectedthattheconsolidat ionof thesefourentitieswillgeneratesavingsslightlygreaterthanthecostsofthisproposal.
- **7. Budgetamendmentnecessary:** Yes.HB1400doesnotreflecttheconsolidation.Items90 and95wouldneedtobeamendedtoreflecttheconsolidation.
- 8. Fiscalimplications: AlthoughthecreationofthenewDepartmentofVeteransServiceswill resultincertainadditionalexpenses, it is expected that these expenses will be offset by efficiencies derived from the consolidation of the four affected entities. Among the additional expenses associated with this proposal are the costs of the salaries and fringe benefits for two new positions (the Commissioner of Veterans Services and a full coordinator for the Joint Leadership Council of Veterans Services associated with meetings of the Board of Veterans Services and Veterans Services Foundation. Intotal, it is expected that these costs will equal \$188,250. It is also expected that these costs would be borne by the general alfund.

Offsettingthecostsoftheproposalaresavingstobegeneratedfromreengineeringthe mannerinwhichgroundskeepingandmaintenanceservicesareprovidedtotheVirginia VeteransCareCenterandtheVirginiaVeteransCemetery,savingsfrom reengineeringthe existingagencies' operationsandservicedeliverymethods,andsavingsgeneratedby

improvements in these existing agencies' revenue collections. In addition, it is expected that the level of support provided by the Department of Vetera ns' Affairs and Virginia Veterans Care Center for board operations will continue to be used for the support of the newboards. Intotal, these four strategies are expected to generates a vings of \$243,200. Table 1 shows the costs associated with this prop osal and the saving sto begenerated from the consolidation of the existing agencies.

Itisexpectedthatanysavingsinexcessofth ecostsassociatedwithconsolidatingthefour existingentitieswillbeusedtohireadditionalclaimssupporttechnicians. These claims supporttechnicians are responsible for assisting Virginia's veterans and their Virginia domiciled spouses, or phans, and dependent sin pursuing claims against the federal government for educational, disability compensation, and medical benefits provided by the federal Department of Veterans' Affairs.

Othercomments: Inadditiontothecha ngesincludedinthisproposal,theGovernoralso includedamonghisamendmentstothe2002AppropriationActaproposalalteringthe operatingstructureoftheVirginiaVeteransCareCenter.Thisproposal,reconstitutingthe agencyasanentirelystate -runenterprise,shouldproducesignificantlong -termsavingsfor theagency,includingreductionsinthecostofmedicalmalpractice,workers'compensation, generalliability,performancebond,automobileinsurance,andpropertyinsurance.Intotal, thesa vingsfromthesereductionsintheagency'sinsurancepremiumsequalabout\$2.5 million(NGF)andwillbeusedtoimproveservicestothecenter's240residents.
